- 1. This year's work included improved reporting regarding campus maintenance & improvements, ADA transition plan review and recommendations work, HEPSS comprehensive review of emergency plan work, and recommendations from the Environmental Task force regarding funding sources plus construction methods/materials that can reduce the campus and district carbon footprint while reducing energy bills. Recommendations included methods of natural ventilation that do not compromise security, methods of thermal massing, recommendations for photovoltaics for solar energy, green roofs, reflective roof coatings, adding bike lanes on campus and more inverted U type bike parking, and goals to be net zero for energy and waste as a campus and district.
- 2. Facility master plan updates, goals and objectives, smoking policy recommendation, updated facility use administrative regulation, active construction project updates, scheduled maintenance project updates, etc.
