This letter is formal notification of the action taken by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) at its meeting in September 2023. The Board of Commissioners granted continuing accreditation to the associate nursing program and scheduled the next evaluation visit for Spring 2031. Please see ACEN Policy #9 Disclosure of Information About an Accredited Program for the required disclosure statement regarding this decision, which must be made to all current and prospective students within seven business days of this letter.

Deliberations centered on the materials available to the Board from this accreditation review process and the recommendation for accreditation proposed by the peer evaluators on the site visit team and the Evaluation Review Panel. Final decisions were made based on the 2023 Standards and Criteria.

The Board identified the following:

## Areas of Strength Standard 3 Students, Criterion 3.4

• Students and faculty stated that student services at the college and within the nursing program are easily accessible, provide a positive experience, and quickly answer questions. The college website uses a tool to help ESL students translate all website information into another language if needed. Additionally, the students are using ebooks and are serviced by faculty using the same tools, such as highlighting, outline, and digital flashcards. The Learning Disability Specialist assists with community resources for testing for learning disabilities, and accommodations are aligned when the student presents the necessary paperwork. Finally, the college uses the RAVE mobile safety app and email to communicate inclement weather or threats to safety. Student services personnel hold training workshops that include earthquake preparedness and school shooter awareness alerts for all students.



# Areas of Strength (Continued) Standard 3 Students, Criterion 3.4

• The President indicated that student services have been impactful in student enrollment (from 8,982 in Fall AY 2021–2022 to 10,076 overall) (combined summer and fall). Student services personnel were having informative workshops along with the Office of Financial Aid to help students enroll. The nursing program has not felt a gap. Students named contact the following personnel: the Student Coordinator, the Academic Counselor, the librarian, the Learning Disability Specialist, and the Dean of Financial Aid. There was one military student who stated that the Veteran Services worked well with all the other services, and he was able to apply and learn about his benefits at SAC through the Student Services and Veteran Affairs Liaison. He had Medical Corp experience for trauma care; his military status helped his onboarding application with points for lived experiences and training.

#### Standard 4 Curriculum, Criterion 4.8

• Ensure the total number of credits required to complete the defined nursing program of study is consistent with the policies of the governing organization and the state.
