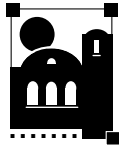

# RANCHO SANTIAGO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

## SANTA ANA COLLEGE



With a history of success and a promise for the future, Santa Ana College has established itself as leader in quality community college education. Santa Ana College is the fourth oldest community college in California, one of 107 in the state and one of eight in Orange County. It is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. The college offers associate degrees in more than 150 majors, certificates in 75 occupational specializations, and lower division transfer courses for advanced degrees at four-year colleges and universities. The college believes strongly in being a leader and partner in meeting the academic, cultural, and workforce development needs of diverse communities.

## SANTIAGO CANYON COLLEGE



Santiago Canyon College is the newest community college in California, and has its roots in the desires of residents of the Orange Unified School District to develop a college campus within their community. The 52-acre college- which previously operated as a center of the Rancho Santiago Community College District- is located in the city of Orange, and more than 10,000 students attended the inaugural semester in Fall 1997. The college offers a full spectrum of general education courses and provides vocational programs designed to be responsive to the individual business and industry needs for short-term training, retraining, and skill enhancement.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM



The International Student Program Center provides a full range of programs and services to help international students adjust culturally and academically to life in the United States. Services include assistance with admissions and registration, housing and transportation, insurance, banking, and immigration, among others. Academic and personal counseling are also available. Students may request placement with an American host family through the Homestay Program or ask for assistance in locating an apartment in the vicinity of the college. In cooperation with the International Student Association, the International Student Program Center sponsors cultural, social, and sports events as well as recreational activities to foster fun and friendship among international students.

# ADMISSION INFORMATION

Applicants who have met all college admissions requirements except the TOEFL score requirement may receive assured admission into the English Language Academy at Santa Ana College in the Rancho Santiago Community College District.

Students entering the college under this admission program will be enrolled in the English Language Academy, where they will receive intensive English language training. Once the students are able to successfully pass the TOEFL with a score of 450, they will be given an automatic transfer into the next college semester at Santa Ana College or Santiago Canyon College. To take advantage of the Assured Admission program, the applicant must complete the application process outlined below:

- Complete the English Language Academy Application. Send the application and ALL other required documents to the International Student Center for the English Language Academy.
- Send the \$50.00 non-refundable Academy application fee and \$200.00 non-refundable tuition deposit— money order, cashier’s check or personal check drawn on a U.S. bank or international bank with a branch in the U.S.- made payable to “**RSCCD – International Student Program**”.
- The RSCCD International Student Center will issue a letter of acceptance to those applicants accepted in the English Language Academy with assured admission to the college. The \$200.00 tuition deposit will be required before the I-20 form is issued.

The \$200.00 tuition deposit is non-refundable, but will be applied to the student’s tuition and will guarantee a place in the Academy session applied for. If a student is unable to attend that session and requests the deposit be transferred to the next Academy session, a new-I-20 will be issued. The deposit will not, however, be transferred if the student fails to enroll in the second session to which he/she was admitted.

# ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACADEMY

The English Language Academy (ELA) is an intensive English as a Second Language program through which international students can increase their English proficiency and then participate more effectively in various academic, professional, and social environments.

The ELA offer a TOEFL-preparatory course designed for international students who plan to attend Santa Ana College or Santiago Canyon College but who need to receive intensive instruction in English so they may achieve a TOEFL score of 450 or better, which is required for entrance into the college credit program.

The English Language Academy conducts sessions throughout the year – in January, March, May, August and October. Each session is eight weeks in length and consists of 24 hours per week of instruction with minimally one week of free time between sessions for student to travel and relax. Students who successfully complete this program are guaranteed an automatic transfer into the college credit program at Santa Ana College or Santiago Canyon College.

Students enrolled in the ELA program will receive intensive practice in English for six hours a day, four days a week. ELA students can also share in the activities and trips which are organized by the International Student Center and the International Student Association. Finally, if students are participating in the Homestay Program, they will be able to experience life in an American home and improve their spoken English in a natural setting outside of the classroom.

## ACADEMIC QUALITY

In the English Language Academy we offer state-of-the-art facilities, outstanding faculty, an average class size of under fifteen students, and individual attention. Our faculty have students as their highest priority. These outstanding instructors are committed to providing the best possible learning experience for the students.

## STUDENTS

Students from over 50 countries in Asia, Europe, Latin America, and the Middle East have attended the English Language Academy Program which encourages ethnic diversity and promotes cross-cultural understanding. Entering students should be secondary school graduates or be at least 18 years of age.

- 8 weeks per session (with one week break between sessions)

- 3 proficiency levels (minimum)
- Reading, listening, speaking, vocabulary, grammar, and cultural instruction

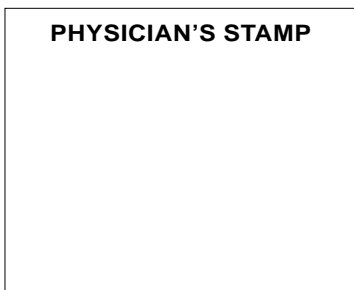

# ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACADEMY DIRECTIONS

The ELA is housed at Santa Ana College in the city of Santa Ana. This campus is located at the corner of Bristol and 17th Streets.



## **From the North - Los Angeles/San Fernando Valley Areas**

Travel south bound on the I-5 (Santa Ana Freeway). Exit at 17th Street. Go west bound on 17th Street to Bristol Street. The college is located on the corner of 17th and Bristol Streets.

## **From the North - Los Angeles Beach Cities**

Travel south bound on the 405 Freeway to the 22 Freeway east. Exit at Bristol. Turn left and travel south on Bristol Street. Turn right at 17th Street. The college is located on the corner of 17th and Bristol Streets.

## **From the West - Long Beach/Garden Grove Areas**

Travel east bound on the 22 Freeway (Garden Grove Freeway). Exit at Bristol Street. Turn left and travel south bound on Bristol Street. Turn right at 17th Street. The college is located at 17th and Bristol Streets.

## **From the East - Riverside/San Bernadino Areas**

Travel west on the 91 Freeway to the 57 south. Take the 57 Freeway south to the 22 Freeway west (Long Beach). Exit at La Veta/Bristol. Turn left on Bristol and go south bound to 17th Street. Turn right on 17th Street. The college is located at 17th and Bristol.

## **From the South - Orange County**

Travel north on the 5 Freeway. Exit at 17th Street and turn left. Go west on 17th Street to Bristol. The college is located at 17th and Bristol Streets.

## **From the South - Orange County Beach Cities**

Travel north on the 55 Freeway (Riverside) to the 5 Freeway north. Exit at 17th Street and turn left. Go west on Bristol Street to 17th. The college is located at 17th and Bristol Streets.
