- 1.1 **SDSU:** Add Sociology 112, Human Development (107 or Psychology 157), 111A, Biology 109 (lab not required), and Math or Social Science 219. The major is "Child Development." This is an impacted program. Major requirements must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher. A cumulative GPA of 2.4 or higher is required.
- 2.1 **CSUF:** Take (Human Development 107 or Psychology 157) and (Human Development 205 or Special Services 205.) Add Human Development 112 for students following the Early Childhood track.
- 2.2 **CSUF:** No upper division credit will be granted for the above SAC courses. The major is "Child and Adolescent Development." See www.assist.org for Child and Adolescent Development-STEP (Streamlined Teacher Education Program) course requirements.
- 3.1 **CSULB:** Take Math 219 or Social Science 219. The major is "Human Development."
