X = Lower division preparation for the major.

- 1.1 **CPP:** Add Speech Communication 140 and English (101H or 103).
- 1.2 **CPP:** Choose four courses from English 231, 232, 241, 242, 271 or 272. Must include one British, one American and one World Literature.
- 1.3 **CPP:** Add Spanish 201 or 195A or 195B or French 201.
- 1.4 **CPP:** The above information applies to the major in English Literature and Language only. For the English Education major take all of the above but instead choose English (231 or 232) and (241 or 242) and (271 or 272).
- 2.1 **CSUF:** The English major consists of 42 units, 30 of which must be upper division. English 101 is not part of the major, but is a prerequisite to further work. Complete at least 6 units from English 231, 232, 241, or 242.
- 3.1 **CSULB:** Foreign language is recommended for all options. Graduate studies in English generally require at least one foreign language.
- 3.2 **CSULB:** Because English 101 satisfies a general education requirement, it is not part of any English option. The English options and required courses are:  
*Literature:* Take English 102, 231, 232, 241, and 242.  
*Rhetoric and Composition:* Take English 102 and choose two courses from: English 231, 232, 241, 242. English 103 or 102H or 103H is recommended but not required.  
*Creative Writing:* Take English 102, 231, 232, and (211 or 214).  
*Special Emphasis:* Take English 102 or 102H. This option will be recognized only if planned in consultation with a CSULB English Department faculty advisor.

*English Education:* (This option satisfies the state-mandated requirement in subject matter competence for the Single Subject Teaching Credential. Take English (231 or 232) and English (241 or 242) and (English 271 or 272 or Theatre Arts 105) and Theatre Arts (100 or 110) and Speech Communication 102. This option has the following emphases:

- a: Africana Studies
- b: Communication Studies
- c: Creative Writing
- d: Journalism - Journalism 121
- e: Literacy and Composition
- f: Language and Linguistics
- g: Literature
- h: Theater Arts - Theater 111
- i: World Literature

- 4.1 **UCI:** One year of lower-division writing must be completed prior to enrolling in any UCI English or Literary Journalism course. In fulfillment to all major requirements a single course may be used only once. Take two courses from English 231, 232, 241, 242, 271, 272. (For Literary Journalism major select one (one required, however, two are required). All other courses requirements for Literary Journalism, and Comparative Literature are the same as English.)
- 4.2 **UCI:** Take French 202 or Spanish 202 (or the equivalent of two years of a modern or classical college level language other than English).
- 4.3 **UCI:** Take a total of four courses, at least one from each area as follows:  
 Writing: English 101, 102, 103, Philosophy 110  
 Literature: English 231, 232, 241, 242, 271, 272 (Choose course other than what was selected for 1.1).  
 History: History 101, 102, 118, 120, 121, 150, 151  
 Philosophy: Philosophy 106, 108, 118

The major preparation listed above ONLY includes courses for which articulation exists. This information is based upon university course articulation and catalog information available at the time of publication. It is to be used as a guide for lower division preparation for the major and not as an official document. **It is the student's responsibility to check the current catalog and articulation for any additional course requirements, or for any changes which may occur.
