- 1.1 **CPP:** Students expecting to pursue graduate study in History should take at least one foreign language.
- 1.2 **CPP:** Two tracks are offered. Track one is for students seeking a broad liberal education. Track two is for prospective teachers. For track two add Anthropology 100, Earth Science 110, Economics 120, 121, (101H or 103), Geography 102, Philosophy 112, Psychology 100 or 230, Political Science 201, Speech Communication 102, 140. Track two students should contact the SAC Center for Teacher Education for additional advisement.
- 2.1 **CSUF:** Take six units from either History 120 and 121, or History 120 and 118, or History 121 and 118 (120 and 121 is preferred).
- 3.1 **CSULB:** History majors are strongly encouraged to include the study of foreign language and literature in their programs.
- 3.2 **CSULB:** Nine lower division History units are required. Select these from History 101, 102, 120, 121.

- 4.1 **UCI:** Take a total of four courses, at least one from each area as follows (a single course may be used only once in the major):  
*Writing:* English 101, 102, 103, Philosophy 110  
*Literature:* English 231, 232, 241, 242, 271, 272  
*History:* History 101, 102, 118, 120, 121, 122, 150, 151  
*Philosophy:* Philosophy 106, 108, 118
- 4.2 **UCI:** Take two courses from two different regions (a single course may be used only once in the major):  
 a) History 101 or 102  
 b) History 120 or 121  
 c) History 150 or 151
- 4.3 **UCI:** Take a French 202 or Spanish 202 (or the equivalent of two years of college level modern or classical language other than English).
- 4.4 **UCI:** Take up to three additional UC transferable courses in history.

The major preparation listed above ONLY includes courses for which articulation exists. This information is based upon university course articulation and catalog information available at the time of publication. It is to be used as a guide for lower division preparation for the major and not as an official document. **It is the student's responsibility to check the current catalog and articulation for any additional course requirements, or for any changes which may occur.
