- 1.1 **CSUF:** Add Spanish 195A or 195B.
- 2.1 **CSULB:** Two college years or equivalent of a second foreign language (other than English) is required. It is also recommended that students majoring in French include History 101 and 102 in their program of study.
- 2.2 **CSULB:** One year of intermediate Spanish at the university level, or equivalent, is a prerequisite to the major. At least one year of a second foreign language at the university level is also required.
- 2.3 **CSULB:** An option in translation is offered.

- 3.1 **UCI:** Take a total of four courses, at least one from each area as follows:
 - Writing:* English 101, 102, 103, Philosophy 110
 - Literature:* English 231, 232, 241, 242, 271, 272
 - History:* History 101, 102, 118, 120, 121, 150, 151
 - Philosophy:* Philosophy 106, 108, 118
- 3.2 **UCI:** Students majoring in Spanish must choose one or more of the following emphases: Literature and Culture; Spanish for Future Teachers; Cinema: Spain, Latin America, and U.S. Latino.

The major preparation listed above ONLY includes courses for which articulation exists. This information is based upon university course articulation and catalog information available at the time of publication. It is to be used as a guide for lower division preparation for the major and not as an official document. **It is the student's responsibility to check the current catalog and articulation for any additional course requirements, or for any changes which may occur.
