X = Lower division preparation for the major.

- 1.1 **CPP:** Take Math or Social Science 219. Add English 101H or 103. Options are offered in Criminology-add Psychology 219, Social Work, and General Sociology.
- 2.1 **CSUF:** A total of nine CSUF advisor-approved units from a community college can be applied to the major. Optional concentrations are offered in Family, Gerontology, Social Work, Education, Sociology of Deviance and Social Problems, and the Sociology of Class, Race and Gender.
- 3.1 **CSULB:** Take Math or Social Science 219.
- 3.2 **CSULB:** Anthropology 100 is recommended as an elective. Concentrations are offered in Deviance and Social Control, Interaction and Group Relations, Medical Sociology, and Social Change and Global Issues.

- 4.1 **UCI:** Add Computer Science (112 and 121) or take another course after transfer. Take Math 180 and 219 or Social Science 219, or complete three quarters of Statistics after transfer.
- 4.2 **UCI:** Take Psychology 240 or Sociology 240.
- 4.3 **UCI:** In fulfillment of all major requirements a single course may be used only once. Take one introductory course from another Social Science Discipline: Anthropology 100, 101, 103, 104, Asian American Studies 101, Chicano Studies, 101, English 104, Economics 120, 121, Ethnic Studies, 101, Environmental Studies 200, Geography 100, 101, 102, Political Science 101, Psychology 100.
- 4.4 **UCI:** Add one additional Social Science course from: Anthropology 105, 108, 125, Human Development 107, Political Science 201, 220, Psychology 157, 200, 219, 240, 250, Sociology 240.

The major preparation listed above ONLY includes courses for which articulation exists. This information is based upon university course articulation and catalog information available at the time of publication. It is to be used as a guide for lower division preparation for the major and not as an official document. **It is the student's responsibility to check the current catalog and articulation for any additional course requirements, or for any changes which may occur.
