- 1.1 **CCP:** a Theatre Arts degree with a choice of five sub plans is offered – General, Acting, Theatre in Education and Community, Technical Theatre and Design, and Dance. See www.assist.org and the current Cal Poly Pomona catalog for course requirements and additional information..
- 2.1 **CSUF:** See www.assist.org for SAC courses required for a Bachelors degree in Theatre Arts (Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Fine Arts). With the Bachelor of Arts concentrations are offered in Liberal Arts, Production/Performance (emphases offered in Directing, Playwriting, Technical Production/Design), and Teaching. With the Bachelor of Fine Arts concentrations are offered in Acting and Musical Theatre. Transfer students selecting the Acting concentration or the Musical Theatre concentration will be evaluated and advised at CSUF as to potential for advancement. Students should contact the CSUF department regarding audition requirements.

- 3.1 **CSULB:** The following options are offered: Performance: Acting/Directing, and Technical Theatre: Scenery/Costume/Lighting Design. Theatre Arts 112 is not required for the Technical Theatre option. Incoming CSULB transfer students are required to audition or interview for admittance to certain upper division classes. No more than eight units of Theatre Arts activity (cast and/or crew) will apply toward degree requirements. See www.assist.org for crew requirements. - 4.1 **UCI:** The major is Drama.

The major preparation listed above ONLY includes courses for which articulation exists.
