



Transfer Articulation Agreement Between University of Northern Iowa and Santa Ana College

It is understood that the following requirements will be met by all students transferring from Santa Ana College to the University of Northern Iowa with an Associate of Arts Degree in International Business with Intersegmental General Education Plan C.

- The Associate of Arts degree will include a minimum of 60 semester hours of 100-level and above courses.
- General education courses are defined as those courses which broaden student knowledge in the arts and sciences. A completed Santa Ana Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum certification of 40 hours will be accepted upon transfer to meet UNI's Liberal Arts Core requirement minus categories 2B and 6. The following general divisions are required:
 - a. Communication-8 semester hours
 - b. Humanities-8 semester hours
 - c. Math and Science-8 semester hours (at least one course in each)
 - d. Social Science-8 semester hours
 - e. Distributed requirement- 8 semester hours taken from among the above 4 divisions
- 3. The remaining 20 semester hours will be accepted from 100-level and above.
- 4. Foreign language proficiency, a course in non-western culture and Capstone requirements must be satisfied for graduation from UNI. Foreign language proficiency can be met with completion of 2 years of the same language in high school or two semesters of the same language in college with a C- or better being earned in the final term. Taking one of the following courses at SAC will satisfy the non-western culture requirement:
 - a. ANTH 105/HIST 105 Ancient Mesoamerican Civilization
 - b. ANTH 125 Native Americans in the US
 - c. HIST 150 Latin American Civilization to Independence
 - d. HIST 163 Introduction to Southeast Asia History

Capstone must be taken at UNI

- 5. Students transferring an Associate of Arts degree to the University of Northern Iowa must have maintained a minimum grade point average of 2.0 on all graded 100-level and above courses (Note: Transfer GPA does not typically include below 100-level courses.)
- 6. Students satisfying the above requirements will be enrolled at junior level status at the University of Northern Iowa.
- 7. Students not completing the Associate of Arts degree may be admitted to the University of Northern lowa; however, this admittance will require a course by course evaluation of the student's transcripts to determine which courses will be accepted for transfer and the student's class level at the University.
- 8. A yearly review of this agreement will be conducted.
- Continuation of the agreement (first effective Spring 2015) is contingent on approval of both cooperating institutions as attested to by the signatures of each of the following.

TRANSFER PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

University of Northern Iowa, College of Business Administration and Santa Ana College

Representatives from the University of Northern Iowa have evaluated Santa Ana College's General Education curriculum with the intent of developing a seamless transfer program for students who wish to transfer to UNI and pursue a BA degree with a major from the College of Business Administration. The business program of study at UNI would complement the two-year SAC curriculum and deliver the additional course work required for the BA degree at UNI. The articulation agreement for the Associate of Arts in International Business with completion of the Intersegmental General Education Plan C is attached.

In addition to the AA degree, students should also complete the following requirements during the first two years at SAC:

- 1. SAC courses which are equivalent to UNI's lower division business core courses:
 - a. ECON 120, Principles of Macroeconomics
 - b. ECON 121, Principles of Microeconomics
 - c. ACCOUNTING 101, Financial Accounting
 - d. ACCOUNTING 102, Managerial Accounting
 - e. BUSINESS 150, Introduction to Information Systems and Applications
 - f. MATHEMATICS 150, Calculus for Biological, Management and Social Sciences
 - g. MATHEMATICS 219 or 219H, (first level statistics)* Statistics and Probability

*Optional: a second level statistics course in addition to MATHEMATICS 219 and equivalent to UNI's ECON 1011 Business Statistics may be completed by students before transfer.

2. UNIBusiness Admission Requirements which includes a 2.50 total cumulative GPA

After completion of the above, students will be in a position to complete the remaining requirements for any undergraduate major in the College of Business Administration within two additional years at UNI.

Note: Students successfully completing SAC's international business program may use the courses as a block to satisfy the majority of requirements for UNI's International Business minor.

ARTICULATION CONSIDERATIONS

- Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum Plan C will satisfy UNI's LAC program minus categories
 2B and 6
- UNI's LAC 2B could be satisfied at SAC by taking one of the following courses at SAC: ANTH 105/HIST 105 Ancient Mesoamerican Civilization ANTH 125 Native Americans in the US HIST 150 Latin American Civilization to Independence HIST 163 Introduction to Southeast Asia History

International Business Requirements

 SAC's International Business courses will be used as a block to satisfy the requirements for UNI's International Business Minor. SAC transfer students will only be required to complete the international experience requirement.

 UNI allows no more than 65 semester hours of community college transfer credit to be counted toward the baccalaureate degree. Students transferring more than 65 units of courses numbered 100 level and above from SAC would still have to complete at least 55 hours at UNI to total 120 credit hours and meet any additional UNI degree requirements.

This agreement will be reviewed annually.
