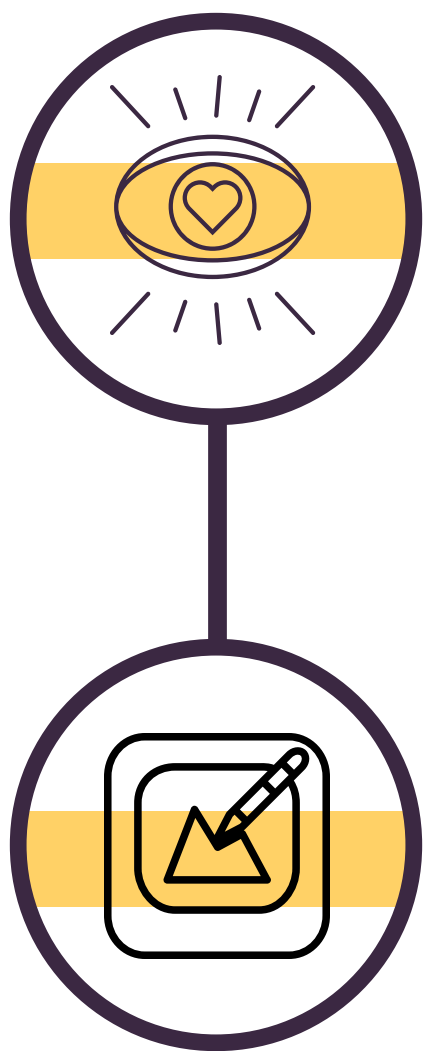




Automatic Captioning Overview



Go to:

YouTube, log in to your account, go to your creator studio

Find:

The video you wish to caption. Press Edit

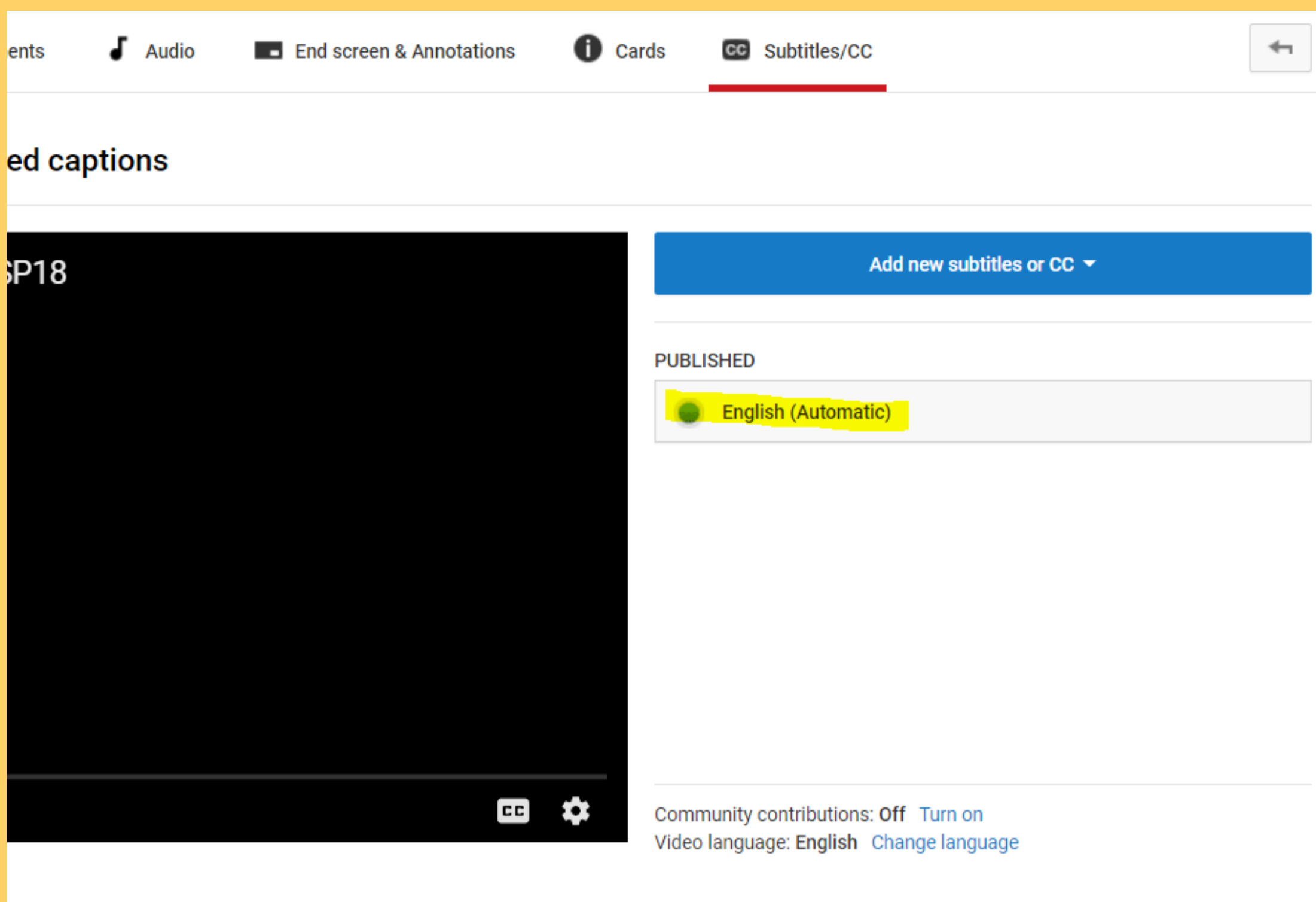
Note: Automatic captioning is not available on all uploaded videos. **ALSO you MUST** edit and double-check all of your YouTube uploaded videos for captioning accuracy

1. After clicking "edit" you will want to click on "Subtitles/CC" link on the top right of the screen

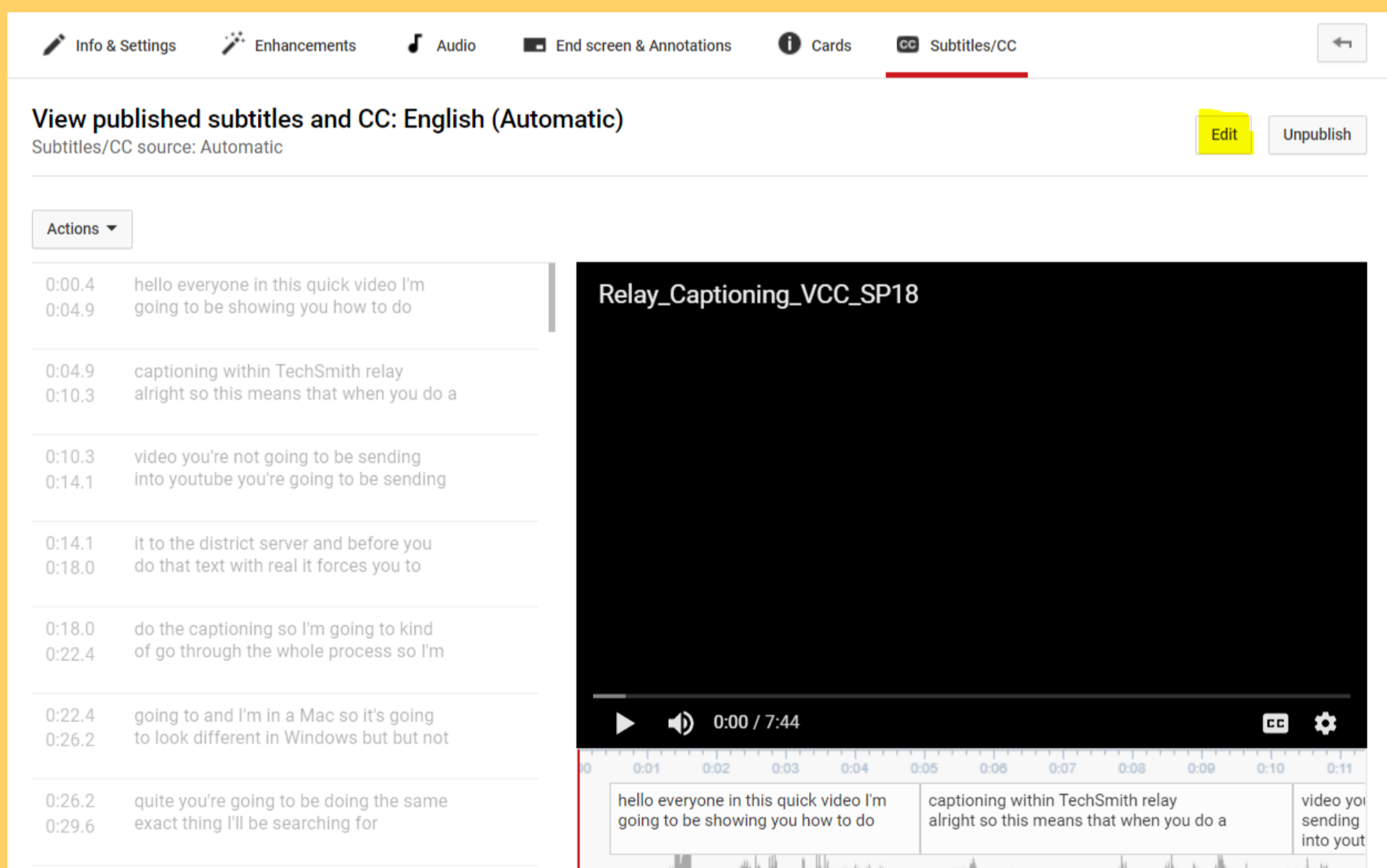
2. Select the language and then press "set language"

Subtitles and closed captions

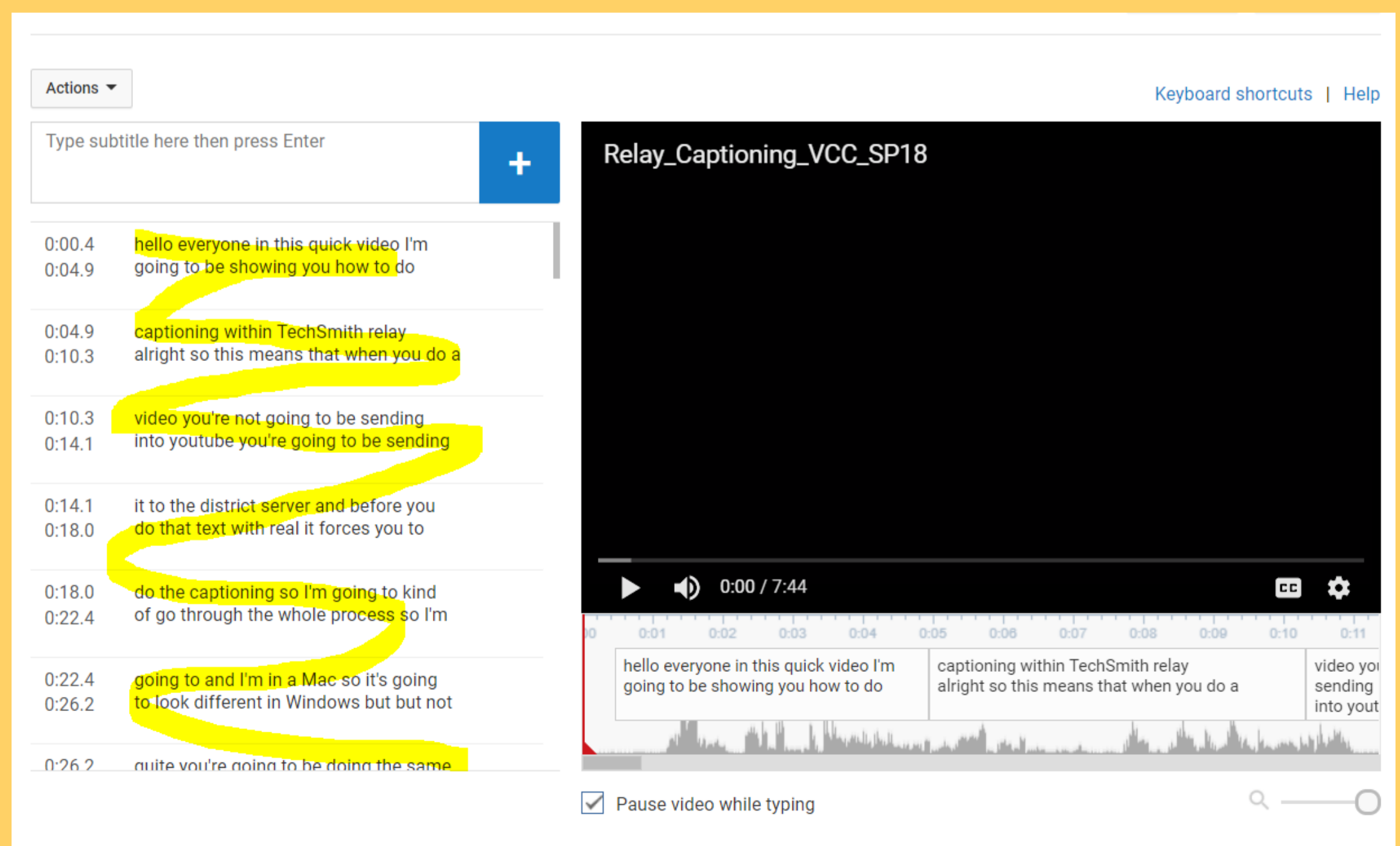
3. Click on the "English (automatic)"

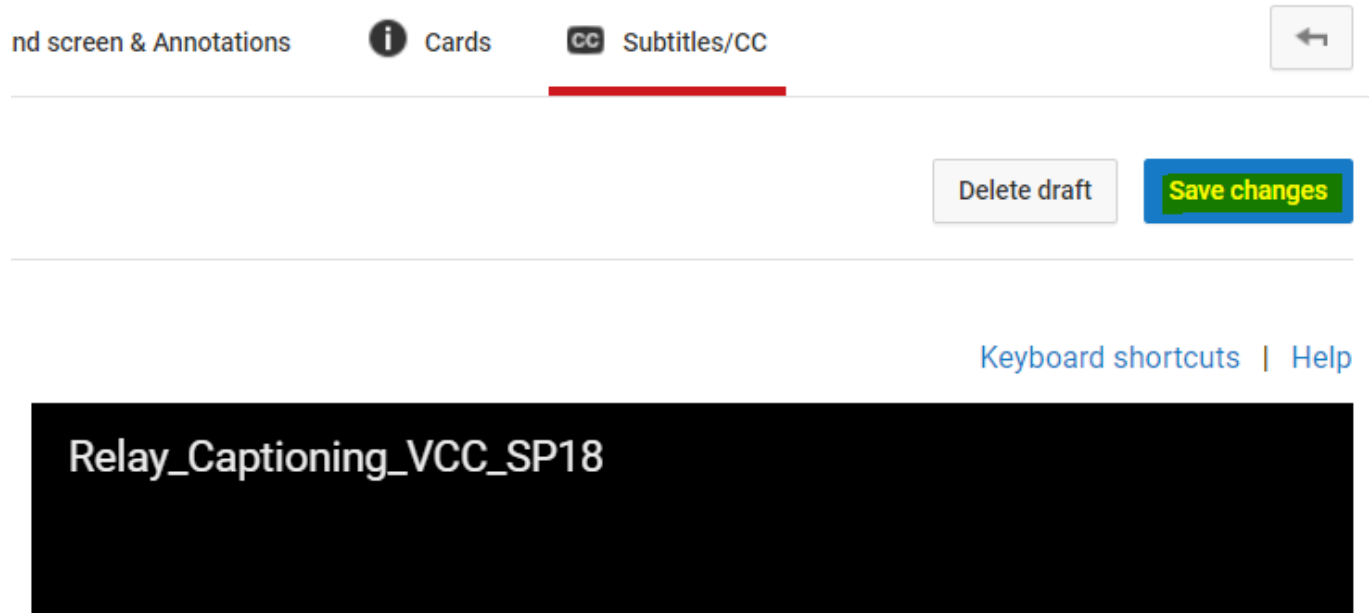


4. Click on "edit" on the top right. This will allow you to review and edit the automatic captions that YouTube creates

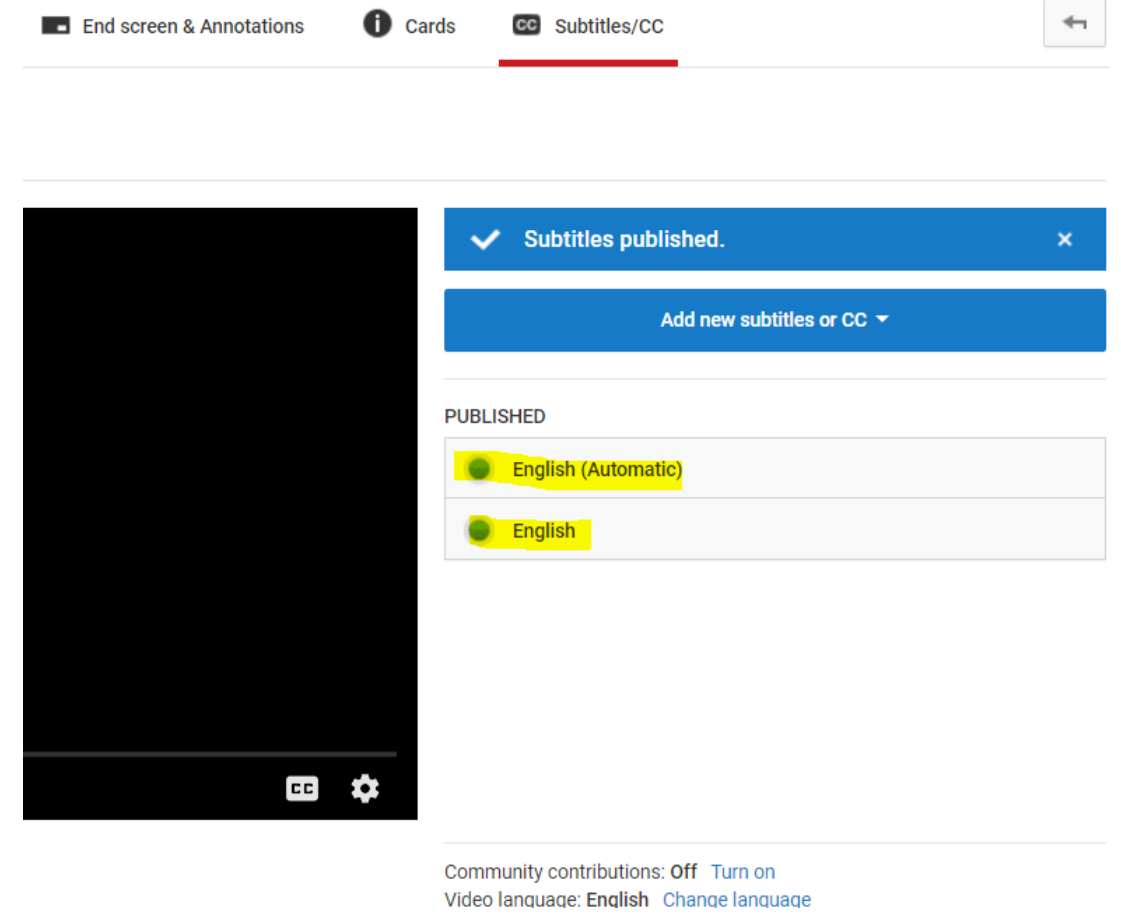


5. You can then follow along and listen to your video. If you notice that YouTube didn't get a word or a phrase correct you can edit the captions.

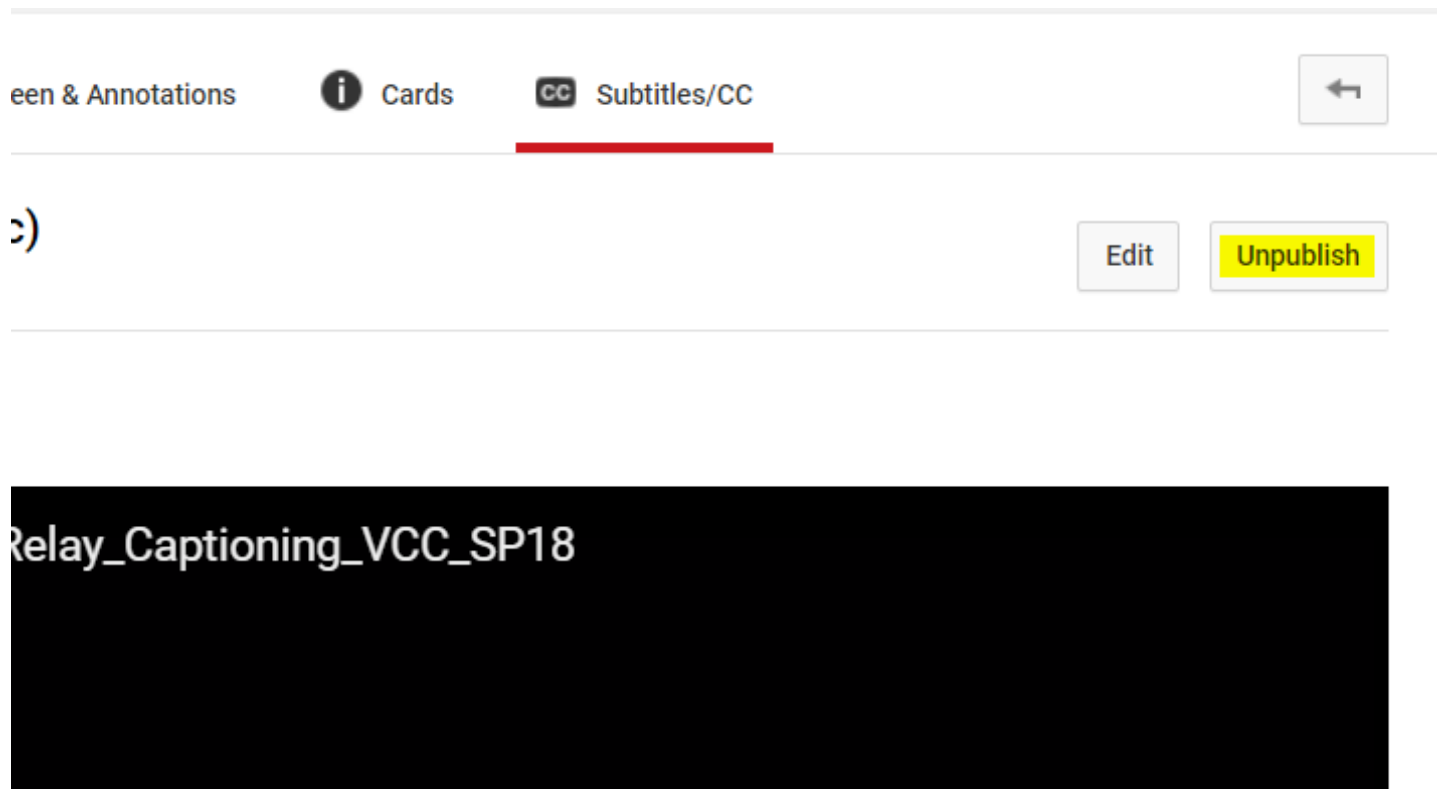




6. After you've finished editing, click "Save Changes"



7. After clicking Save you'll notice in that you have TWO published set of captions. The "automatic" one that YouTube created and the edited, English one that you created. To remove or "unpublish" the automatic one, click on "English (Automatic)"



8. At the top, you'll notice a button that says "Unpublish." Clicking on this will unpublish YouTube's captions and leave only your edited captions active and published.

Always remember, that programs like YouTube's automatic captioning can and does make mistakes. While it is a useful tool, always make sure you review and edit as necessary to provide accuracy for your students
