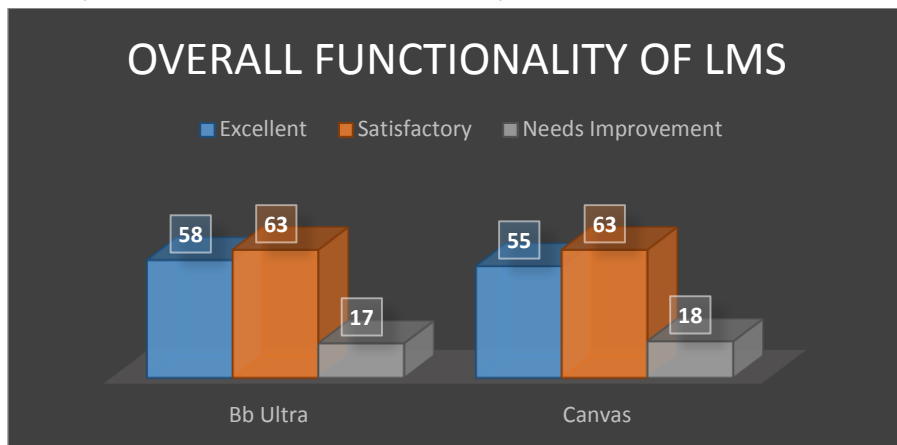
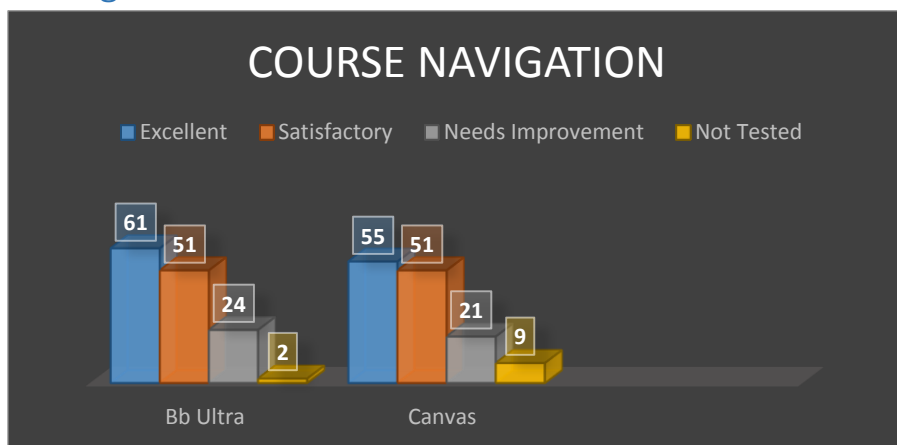


LMS Student Survey Results/Summary

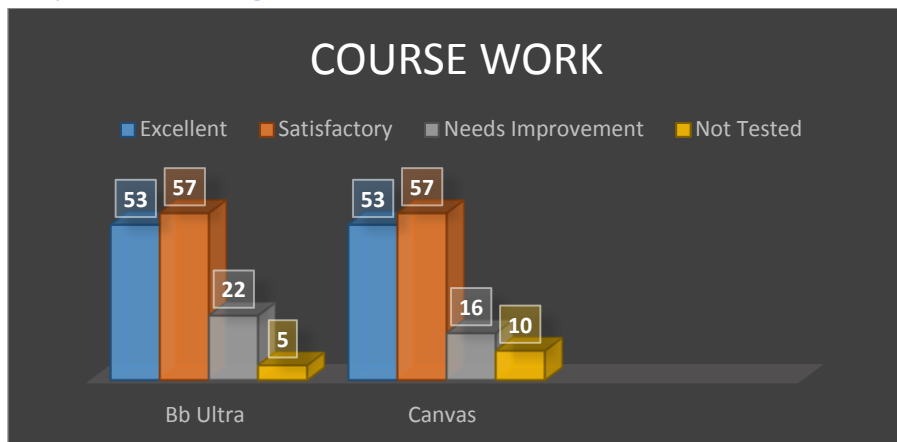
Overall, how would you rate the functionality of the LMS:



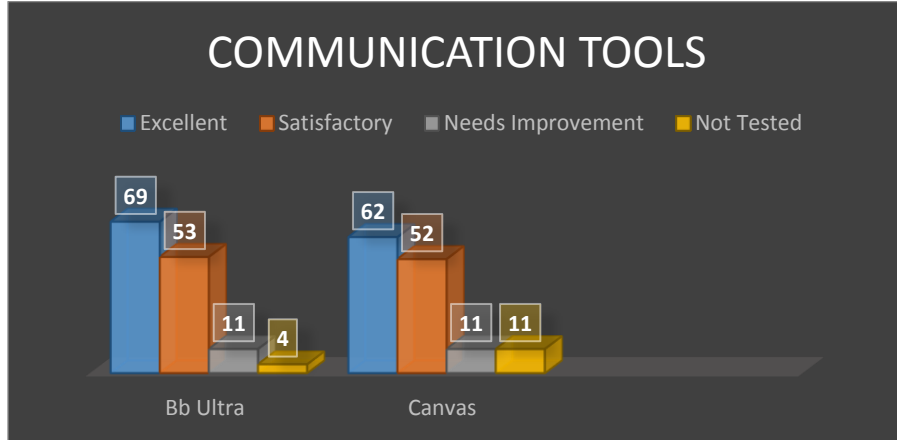
Course Navigation: Please rate the functionality of navigating through the course, locating and accessing course material.



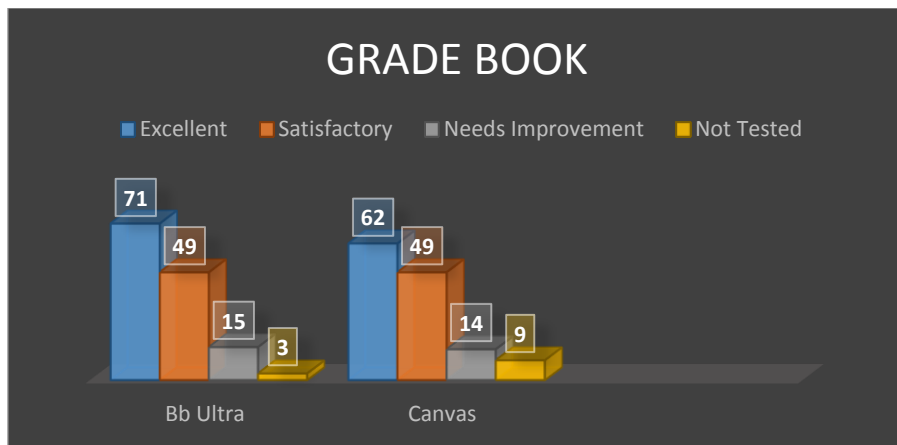
Course Work: Please rate the ease of accessing and completing course work, including tests or quizzes, assignments, and discussion boards.



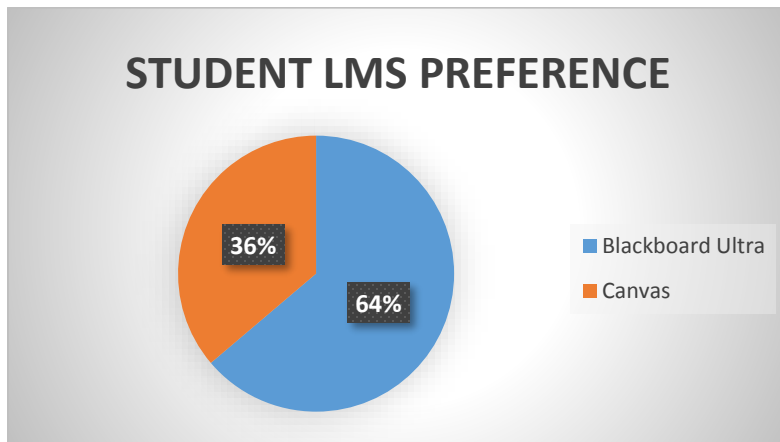
Communication Tools: Please rate the ease of access and using other communication tools, including the syllabus, announcements, calendar, Email/messaging, and personal notification settings.

Overall, what did you dislike most about Canvas?

- “I disliked the organization of Canvas and how course information is presented to students, because too much information (such as announcements, what's upcoming) is presented at once instead of being organized into categories that it becomes overwhelming.”
- “This just has too many... for lack of a better term, widgets for my liking. I'm on the site for the material and I think it seems like the developers tried to make it easier to navigate, but sacrificed quality. “
- “I did not like Canvass that much. It was not familiar and I wasn't able to easily recognize how to use it. The navigation was confusing and the discussion area was SO confusing. I felt like it was too simplified and I wasn't given enough freedom to navigate the course. It felt dumbed down and too simplified. I did not like the left side with the ‘Home, Announcements, Grades,

Syllabus.' I like all the links in Bb's left side menu bar. I wish each of the links on the left side opened up to reveal what was in each page."

- "Canvas just wasn't user friendly or appealing to the eye, and I feel like those are both things that are necessary to keep students interested."
- "Canvas was too plain, and difficult to find certain links."
- "Wasn't as user friendly."

SUMMER PILOR PARAMETERS:

- 7 Courses were part of the pilot.
 - 2 courses from SCC
 - 5 courses from SAC
 - The disciplines included in the pilot were Accounting, Business, Computer Science, Kinesiology, Music, and Philosophy.
- The survey encompassed 139 student responses from a total 286 students, or a total of 49% participation from students in the courses.
- Students were asked to explore a few units of the same course that they were enrolled in for the summer in both Blackboard Ultra and Canvas, then provide their observations and opinions about the two LMS.
