Business Administration Major Preparation for Transfer :: Online

Here is how the program works:

- · Courses will run in an intensive eight-week format.
- Students will generally take two classes per eight-week session.
- Courses are designated and reserved for students in the Online Degree Pathway.
- Students take the fixed sequence of prescribed courses in a cohort grouping.
- Prior coursework will be considered for graduation requirements. Students are not expected to take unnecessary courses in the pathway. Our objective is to have students complete and graduate as quickly as possible.
- Once students complete the business Administration Major Preparation, they may transfer into California State University, Fullerton's online completion program to earn their bachelor's degree in business administration if they have completed their general education requirements.

The program is designed for students who:

- · Need a flexible class/study schedule
- Are working, have busy schedules and want to be a fulltime student
- · Learn best in their own environment
- · Want to have a structured approach to their coursework
- Students who have completed their CSU General Education breadth pattern of courses for CSU transfer and require only the CSU Fullerton Lower Division Business major preparation courses:
 - Admission to the California State University system with junior status to complete a bachelor's degree in business administration
 - Access to entry-level jobs such as real estate, sales, administration, marketing, human resources, and more.

Example Salary Range

According to Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) data from 2014, there is a wide range of salaries for business administration workers. For human resources assistants, a position requiring an associate degree, the median salary was \$38,040.

With a bachelor's degree, a six-figure income is not unusual. According to BLS data, the median salary for marketing managers in 2014 was \$127,130 per year.

- Students in the Online CSU, Fullerton Lower Division Business Administration major preparation pathway take a fixed sequence of courses in a cohort grouping. The following course sequence was developed for students planning to transfer to CSUF as a Business Administration major. Other colleges and universities may have similar course requirements for their Business Administration majors, however they may not be identical. Students are urged to meet with a SAC counselor regarding their specific transfer plans.
