 - 1) Education Code Section 78016 (a) Every vocational or occupational training program offered by a community college district shall be reviewed every two years by the governing board of the district to ensure that each program, as demonstrated by the California Occupational Information System, including the State-Local Cooperative Labor Market Information Program established in Section 10533 of the Unemployment Insurance Code, or if this program is not available in the labor market area, other available sources of labor market information, does all of the following:
 - Meets a documented labor market demand.

Notes

a. The final vote by the Board of Governors is anticipated to occur in March 2015. No Baccalaureate degree (BD) is currently available at any community college in California. A substantive change will be submitted to ACCJC at a later date for the Associate Degree (AA) if approved by BOG in March. Presently, there is not an accrediting agency that oversees granting the BD. ACOTE is the accrediting agency that governs the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program at the AA level. Currently, ACOTE is not in support of the BD program; however, discussions are ongoing. CSU Long Beach offers an Occupational Studies Program; however, the emphasis of that program and degree is not OTA-based. The BS Program at SAC will create a bridge to the MS and/or Ph.D. programs at the CSU and UC level.

- Does not represent unnecessary duplication of other manpower training programs in the area.
- Is of demonstrated effectiveness as measured by the employment and completion success of its students.
- (b) Any program that does not meet the requirements of subdivision (a) and the standards promulgated by the governing board shall be terminated within one year.
- (c) The review process required by this section shall include the review and comments by the local Private Industry Council established pursuant to Division 8 (commencing with Section 15000) of the Unemployment Insurance Code, which review and comments shall occur prior to any decision by the appropriate governing body.
- (d) This section shall apply to each program commenced subsequent to July 28, 1983.
- (e) A written summary of the findings of each review shall be made available to the public.
- 2) Title 5 Section 55003(b)(4) A district governing board choosing to establish prerequisites, corequisites, or advisories on recommended preparation shall, in accordance with the provisions of sections 53200-53204, adopt policies for the following: the process, including levels of scrutiny, for reviewing prerequisites and corequisites to assure that they remain necessary and appropriate. These processes shall provide that at least once each six years all prerequisites and corequisites established by the district shall be reviewed, except that prerequisites and corequisites for vocational courses or programs shall be reviewed every two years. These processes shall also provide for the periodic review of advisories on recommended preparation.
