Getting the opportunity to be a student intern at the Orange County District Attorney's office was such a privilege as I was able to get hands on experience with attorneys, paralegals and other professionals. I learned how to communicate with clients and how the court system operates in criminal cases. Learning how to communicate and have relations with peers and other professionals has helped me in not only my internship but also my studies. A huge aspect of what I learned was also how to use different software such as Vision, CMS and Adobe Pro. All of these skills have helped me establish skills that are vital for future jobs in the field of law.

Before my internship, I had no experience in the legal field and had no idea if I would even like it, so I found an internship in order to help me determine if this was the right field for me. Thanks to Theresa and Kim Smith, I started interning at the Legal Aid doing civil law for the summer. This helped me realize that civil law wasn't for me. However, in the fall I began a criminal law internship and completely fell in love with criminal law. These internships helped me gain the experience and skills I needed to thrive and helped me decide on a career pathway that is right for me.

Some of the tasks performed during my internship included compiling trial binders, redacting discovery, and organizing discovery. At first, these tasks were challenging as we were always on a time constraint. I would only come in twice a week so getting everything done correctly and in a timely manner often presented difficulties since I did not have the luxury of getting to come in every day. I overcame these obstacles by planning my time efficiently and setting goals to accomplish that day so I would not fall behind and miss a deadline.

I believe this definitely did make me a stronger candidate for employment. This internship has made me more well-rounded, which I believe is an appealing quality for a future employer. I am well versed not only in civil law but also in criminal law.

This past Spring I have finished and graduated from SAC as a political science major and I am very fortunate to say that I will continue my education and pursue my B.A at UCLA in the Fall as a Pre-Political Science major.

Over the course of 10 weeks, I had the honor of interning at Santa Ana College as a Volunteer Income Tax Assistant.

During my time as an intern at Santa Ana College I was entrusted with the responsibility of preparing federal and state income tax returns. I would conduct thorough interviews with clients to ensure that I prepared an accurate tax return and performed quality reviews of other students' tax returns. There were instances where I came across scenarios that I did not know how to approach. Thankfully, there were several experts there to guide me. Additionally, I felt nervous at times because I did not know what scenario would come next. In Tax Accounting, the only way to learn is by becoming exposed to different cases.

During the course of my internship, I was able to use a learning experience as a way to give back to the community. Helping others has always been my passion and I was able to do that by allowing taxpayers to save money on their tax preparation fees. Since my goal is to become a Certified Public Accountant, I believe that this experience is a start that exposes me to similar practices that accountants encounter.
