**COURSE TITLE: Motorcycle Instructor Training Course CJA 060A**

1. Demonstrate safe operation of a police motorcycle
2. Appraise motorcycle and training information necessary for beginning enforcement students
3. Evaluate student driving skills during exercises and highway driving demonstrations

5. Identify instructor liability issues related to law enforcement motorcycle training
