The Santa Ana College Research Office will be gathering and/or calculating the course completion rates, persistence rates, units completed, GPA, degree completion, transfer rates and other academic outcomes for the BA cohorts. These outcomes will be disaggregated by gender, age, race, income related variables and other equity variables. The Research Office will also be providing data analysis regarding the overall impact of the program on students enrolled in the program. The data will be provided to the OTA program administration, campus administration, BA OTA committee, and Legislative Analyst's Office.

The Research plan related to the OTA BA program have been informed by attendance of the Director of Research at the CCC Baccalaureate Degree Pilot Program Symposium on October 14, 2016 and Bachelor's Degree Program Conference on July 10, 2017.

In preparation for supporting this program with data, the Director of Research:

- Attended the OTA Symposium and Conference.
- Assigned a Research Analyst to focus on the data requirements of this program.
- Receives a regular file of BA program participant identifier from the office of admissions and registration
- Revised the "California Bachelor Degree Program Institutional Research and Data Collection" Form provided by the Bachelor's Degree Program Conference (Attached)
- Discussed future student satisfaction surveys with OTA faculty.
