The department has received an overwhelming response, and students are waiting up to 1 hour for instructors to check DLAs. Our research reveals that DLAs have already INCREASED TEST SCORES by an average of 6% (see Appendix A and B).	Our primary SLO is for students to develop communication skills in both oral and written form with fair expectations of grammatical accuracy. To achieve such goals, the dept. created specific DLAs that enhance our student's skills in reading, listening, writing, and speaking. We can already see tangible improvements in the form of higher test scores, which are likely to improve our retention rates even further.
