- ◆ Travel back in time and tour Hearst Castle with docents in period costumes to see it decorated for Christmas as it may have been in the 1920s

On this holiday-themed journey we follow the footsteps of Father Junipero Serra as we tour several California Missions and the grandest Mansion in all of California – Hearst Castle. Stay at the charming Apple Farm Inn, the Cambria Pines Lodge and at a quaint Inn in the heart of Old Town Monterey during the Christmas in the Adobes. We'll travel by train, travel the backroads and see first-hand how spectacular California is beautifully decorated for the holidays.

◆DAY 1 ~ COASTAL TRAIN RIDE◆

This morning we set out from our departure points for the tranquility of the *Apple Farm Inn* and California's Central Coast. We'll travel by motorcoach to Oxnard to board **Amtrak's *Coast Starlight***. We'll embark on a memorable journey along California's coastline and through fertile valleys to San Luis Obispo. Traveling by rail will allow you to see much of the California coast and backroads normally hidden from the roads traveled by car. You are free to move around the train, get lunch from the snack bar or sit in the dining car. Check out the view from the sightseeing dome viewing car or just relax in your seat. Upon our arrival in San Luis Obispo, our coach will be waiting to take us the short distance to the quaint ***Apple Farm Inn*** – our accommodations for tonight. Nestled by San Luis Obispo Creek and surrounded by mountains, the *Apple Farm Inn* is a beautiful Victorian style 4-diamond Inn situated among a lush, quiet garden setting. The Inn blends the country charm of yesteryear with all of the modern comforts we expect today including a fireplace in every room and a heated pool year round. This time of year the Inn will be beautifully decorated for the holidays. Enjoy the Inn's complimentary reception prior to dinner at leisure at the *Apple Farm Inn* Restaurant.

◆DAY 2 ~ SLO TO MONTEREY◆

Enjoy an included breakfast this morning before we continue north from San Luis Obispo. Today we journey to Monterey while traveling along the **El Camino Real**, better known as US-101. A footpath, called The Camino Real, or Kings Highway, was created to connect outposts created by Spaniards and Mexicans. Each outpost, called a Mission, was a day's travel apart and were linked by the El Camino Real. This morning we stop and tour **Mission San Miguel Arcangel**, the 16th Mission built in California. It's a fascinating look into the great history of California's past.

TRAVEL PROTECTION / CANCELLATION

This afternoon is set aside for you to enjoy time at your leisure at Monterey's **Cannery Row**, made famous by John Steinbeck. The ocean canyon surrounding Monterey Bay is deeper than the Grand Canyon and harbors a rich variety of sea life, which can be seen this afternoon on an optional excursion to the world-famous **Monterey Bay Aquarium**. Here you can explore the hidden world of this spectacular ocean realm at the heart of the nation's largest marine sanctuary. Our accommodations for the next two nights will be at the charming *Casa Munras*. This evening we'll enjoy an **included dinner** at a local favorite. (Breakfast, Dinner)

♦ DAY 3 ~ MONTEREY PENINSULA ♦

After an included breakfast at our hotel this morning we embark on a tour of the **Monterey Peninsula** with a **local guide**. Landscape artist Francis McComas once claimed the Monterey Peninsula to be "the greatest meeting of land and sea..." For centuries, artists, poets, explorers and novelists have been drawn to the rugged beauty here. The crashing surf. The towering redwoods. The unspoiled wildlife. These exceptional qualities join together, delivering a sense of timelessness and reconnection. The Monterey Peninsula is the embodiment of the quintessential California spirit. We'll travel through historic **Monterey, Pacific Grove, Pebble Beach, Carmel** and along **17-Mile Drive**. Take in the views of **Cannery Row, Cypress Point, the Pebble Beach Golf Course** and the tenacious **Lone Cypress**. You will have ample time to enjoy the quaint town of **Carmel** at your leisure. This popular retreat for writers, artists and celebrities has great boutiques and galleries. This afternoon we tour the **Carmel Mission**, considered one of the most beautiful missions in the chain of nine missions that stretches along California's Central Coast. Officially "Mission San Carlos Borromeo Del Rio Carmelo", it sits behind adobe walls and features Moorish architectural elements including a bell tower and golden exterior. See two separate museums, a replica of the Mission's kitchen and library, and a recreation of Father Serra's ascetic "cell." At the foot of the main altar lies the final resting place of the founder of the Californian Missions, Father Junipero Serra, who died in 1784 at the age of 71. This evening we step back into Monterey's past during **Christmas in the Adobes**. The twenty three 19th-century adobes, lit by luminaries are within an easy walk of each other and our hotel. See the adobes by candlelight and enjoy refreshments and live performances as volunteers in period attire welcome you into historic homes decorated in historical style. Learn while you celebrate; docents and volunteers will be on hand to tell the story of each of these charming buildings, many of which are only open to the public during this celebration. ♦ DAY 4 ~ MONTEREY TO CAMBRIA ♦

Following an included breakfast this morning we travel south from Monterey to Paso Robles where we will cross over the Santa Rosa Mountains to **Cambria**. This afternoon, enjoy time for lunch and browsing in the quaint and unique shops of Cambria – beautifully decorated this time of year. This evening take a docent-guided tour of **Hearst Castle**, once the hilltop estate of newspaper publisher, film producer and art collector William Randolph Hearst. During the holiday season, the Castle is lavishly decorated and docents are in period costumes allowing you the opportunity to experience the Castle as it might have been on Christmas in the 1920s or 1930s. Following an included dinner with a choice of entrée at a local favorite, we stay overnight at the **Cambria Pines Lodge**, surrounded by its unique gardens and Monterey pines it too is magically decorated for the season. (Breakfast, Dinner)

♦ DAY 5 ~ SANTA BARBARA, VENTURA ♦

After an included breakfast this morning at our hotel, we continue south to explore the beauty of **Santa Barbara**. We'll visit the "Queen of the Missions" – **Mission Santa Barbara**. Founded on December 4, 1786, it was the tenth of 21 Franciscan missions in California and still functions as a church today. We continue south arriving in **Ventura** this afternoon. Early California history permeates Ventura's quaint downtown. Historic homes, museums, boutiques, antique shops and restaurants adorn the palm tree-lined streets. Father Junipero Serra knew just what he was doing when he named this mission town "San Buenaventura," translated as the "city of good fortune." **Mission San Buenaventura**, was the ninth of California's 21 missions and the last to be established by Father Serra. You will have time to visit the Mission if you choose or spend the time at leisure browsing the quaint downtown shops and antique stores with time for lunch. Arriving at our departure points this evening, we'll relish in the memories of our early California "Christmas". (Breakfast)
