2. Windows 11 & Adobe CC Licenses

Computers will have to move to Windows 11 soon because support for Windows 10 will end 10/2025. Steve Bautista – please work with instruction and student services for the rollout plan

Ron continues with updates about Adobe CC licenses. Since Covid, courses using Adobe had modalities shift from in-person to online which increased costs. Would like to continue working with the Senate for clarity on what classes need Adobe

<u>Kim Smith</u> – our classes don't teach Adobe, but use Adobe for assignments because it is the industry standard

<u>Ron Gonzalves</u> – would like to work with areas that are unsure if they need Adobe. The Academic Computing Center should get it if they need.

<u>Susan Hoang</u> – are you talking about specific programs? Are there individual licenses?

Ron Gonzalves – I am referring to the Adobe CC Suite, because some programs are free. But if you need the editor then we can get that.

<u>Darren Hostetter</u> – how are you checking classes if they need it?

Ron Gonzalves – we are looking into a process to designate classes

Presentation about calculating FTES, Positive Attendance, productivity & efficiency metrics:

FTES = OUTPUT = WORKLOAD = REVENUE, Fill Rates, efficiency vs. inefficiency, considerations and future plans. Presentation uploaded to BoardDocs & SAC Senate website

Susan Hoang – in terms of productivity, are we looking at students over time in different class sizes?

<u>Jeff Lamb</u> – doesn't have that data yet, but would like to follow up on that. If lower caps increase to increase completion then that is data we want to follow

<u>Jorge Lopez</u> – would like administration to consider the timing of these changes because last minute changes can lead to negative outcomes

<u>Jeff Lamb</u> – yes, that happens and we are working towards reducing those effects

<u>Steve Bautista</u> – what is our goal as a college? Do we want more online offerings or in-person courses? I think there are many factors other than revenue when determining classroom caps
