| <b>CSU</b> has an American Institutions graduation requirement that is separate from IGETC. Courses used to meet the CSU requirement can usually also be used in Area 3 or 4. To meet the CSU requirement, students should take Political Science 101** or 101H** <b>AND</b> one of the following courses: History 118, 120**, 120H**, 121**, 121H**, 123, 124**, 124H**, 127, 146.<br><b>UC</b> requires the completion of a college course or courses with a grade of "C" or better <b>OR</b> a one-year course in high school in U.S. History or a half-year course in U.S. History and a half-year course in American Government with grades of "C" or better (UCLA requires grades of "B"). UCSB requires the completion of a college course. 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| <p>It is generally recommended that students complete all the listed requirements for IGETC and receive full certification prior to transferring. Students may obtain partial certification however by completing all but 1-2 courses. <b>CAUTION:</b> IGETC completion is not recommended, or in some cases accepted, by all UC campuses and/or majors. Your counselor can also help you determine your best path.</p> <p><b>IGETC "Certification"</b> refers to the official notification provided by Santa Ana College that a student transferring to any UC or CSU campus has completed courses fulfilling lower-division general education requirements. Without certification students will be held to the general education requirements specific to the UC or CSU campus to which they transfer. Students fully certified in IGETC are also qualified to receive a Certificate of Achievement in IGETC. Courses from other California Community College campuses will be applied to the same GE area for which they were approved at the college where they were completed. Courses taken at other regionally accredited institutions (which do not maintain an IGETC certification list) will be placed in the subject areas for which Santa Ana College has equivalent courses. In some cases non-equivalent courses may also be considered. Please see your counselor for additional information.
