All California teachers must meet a basic skills requirement and demonstrate knowledge in their subject area curriculum




CBEST: California Basic Educational Skills Test

Quick facts


The CBEST is designed to test basic reading, math, and writing skills found to be important for the job of an educator; the test is not designed to measure the ability to teach those skills

1. Reading Comprehension - 50 multiple choice questions
2. Math - 50 multiple choice questions
3. Writing - 2 essays; personal experience and an issue topic
4. Passing score valid for life
5. Paper-based and Computer-based testing options



CSET: California Subject Exam for Teachers

Quick Facts



1. Based on current California Curriculum Standards K-12
2. Used to demonstrate subject area knowledge and competency
3. Currently passing scores valid for 10 years
4. Multiple choice and constructed response question formats
5. Computer-based testing only

Each CSET exam is designed to measure a specific set of knowledge, skills, and/or abilities reflecting the subject area taught.
