CONFIRMATION:

Registration received by mail will be confirmed if you send a self-addressed stamped envelope. Registration received by phone and online will automatically receive a confirmation. If you do not receive a confirmation in 5 business days, call our office at (714) 564-6594. Non-receipt of confirmation does not warrant a refund.

REFUND & TRANSFER POLICY FOR ALL EVENTS:

Refund and transfer requests must be submitted at least five (5) business days before the class start date and are subject to a \$25 processing fee per person. Any cancellations or transfer request made the same week (5 days prior) to the start of the class are NOT eligible for a refund or transfer. A voucher can be requested in its place. Day Tours may be canceled up to 10 days prior to departure minus a \$25 processing fee. A refund will only be issued if your space can be re-sold. You may send a substitute in place. Non receipt of confirmation does not warrant a refund for any event.

RETURNED CHECKS & REFUNDS BY CHECK, CASH OR MONEY ORDER:

A \$25 fee will be charged for any returned check. In addition, an administration hold placed against your student records and a class stop will be issued. Refunds issued for cash, check or money order transactions may take 4-5 weeks to process with a completed W-9 form.

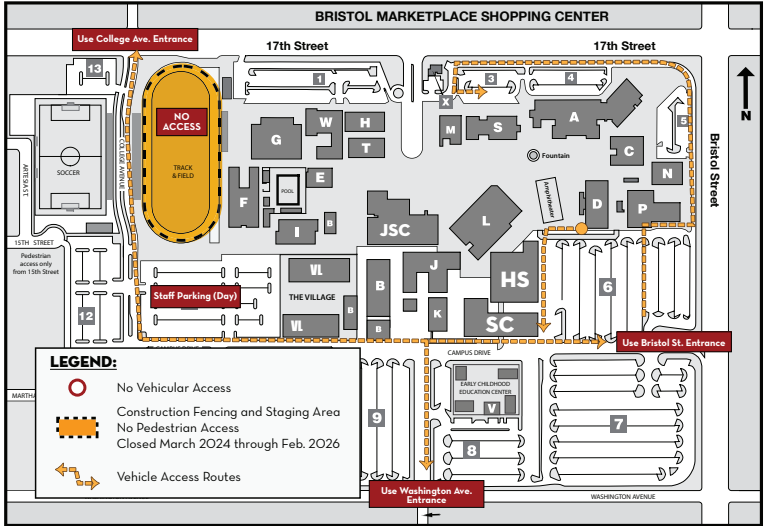

During this time, parking permits are not required at either campus. Families and students may park without purchasing or displaying a permit. Citations will resume 8/8.

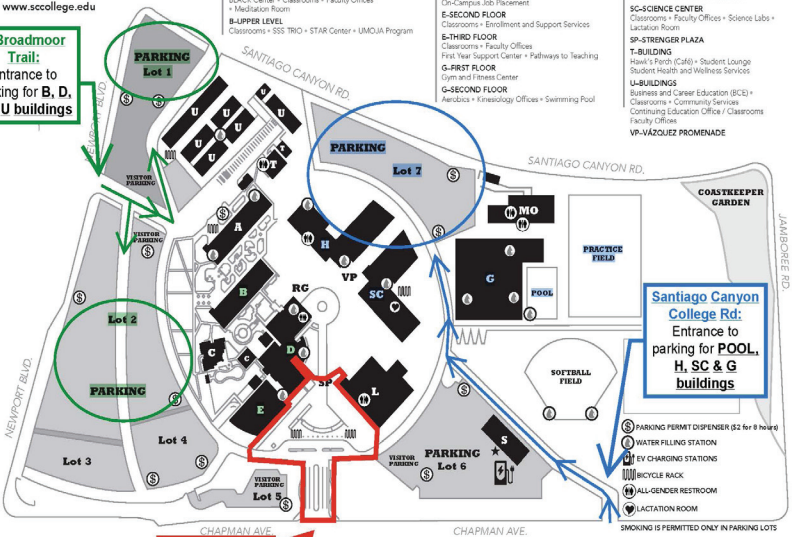

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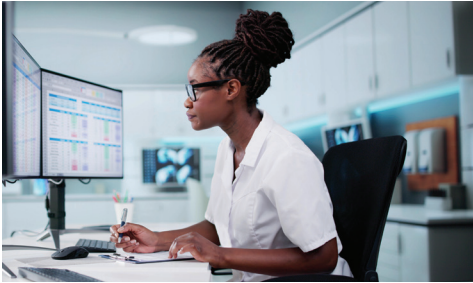

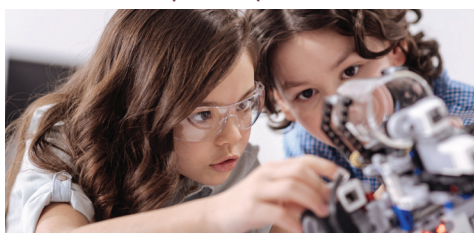
