Key Discussions Point

1. Agenda Adjustment and September 3 minutes

CEP Implementation Subcommittee was removed from the agenda and the modified agenda was accepted. .

AI-generated summary of the September 3 meeting was shared. The summary lacked attendance records so attendees were asked to type names in the chat. Approval of minutes was tabled until the next meeting after updates.

2. Committee Charge Revision

The committee is clarifying its role in institutional planning. Proposed changes aim to make the committee more assertive and accountable. There was debate over wording (e.g., “create” vs. “coordinate”) to reflect advisory vs. directive roles. There was general agreement to use terms like “coordinate creation and implementation” to soften directive tone.

3. Accreditation & Program Review

IE&A will continue to support accreditation processes and program review. Clarification is needed on how the committee “supports” outcomes. Suggestions included aligning language with existing program review structures.

4. Meeting Frequency & Duration

Due to workload and strategic importance, members discussed extending meeting duration (e.g., 2 hours) or meeting more frequently (e.g., biweekly). A poll will be conducted to determine availability and preferences.

5. Membership Structure

Current structure includes faculty reps from Senate divisions, which may not align with operational divisions. Suggestions included streamlining membership to improve quorum and representation (e.g., by role rather than division).
