APPENDIX B Partnerships with SAC Library

 OCLA's mission is to "promote the interest of all libraries in Orange County, to develop good public relations, to provide a means of exchange of information and to promote interlibrary cooperation". SAC has had representation on this local library association for many years. For the past 10 years, SAC Library faculty has participated as a Board Member, and since Spring of 2007, as President.
- Spring 2009 Reference Consultations (Pilot) SAC Librarian established small group, (maximum 6 students) one-hour reference consultations tailored to students' specific assignments. Students sign-up in advance and must bring their assignments to session. In this manner, library instruction is tailored to students' needs and therefore becomes much more meaningful and relevant to student.
- February 12, 2009 SAC Librarian contacted Maggie Barnes, District Librarian of Santa Ana Unified School District. Purpose of e-mail was to "re-connect", network and establish a <u>formal</u> working relationship between SAUSD Library operations, SAUSD libraries and the Santa Ana College Library Technology Program. On February 18th, SAC Librarian received a positive response from Maggie Barnes: "I'd love to set up a time to meet with you.. so could drop by your office one day. Let me know when is a good time for you". Meeting and tour of Nealley Library will take place during the month of May 2009.
- March 12, 2009 SAC Librarian participated in first meeting of the Matriculation Non-Credit to Credit Transition Subcommittee meeting conducted in D-418. Purpose of subcommittee is "to insure the successful matriculation of students from SAC's SCE to SAC's main/credit campus, and to improve communication in basic skills programs across all SAC campuses". SAC Librarian will attend second meeting of the subcommittee scheduled for April 30, 2009.
- March 18, 2009 Centennial Education Center, SAC Librarian conducted a two-hour "Connect from Home, Resources Available to You and Your Students" Staff Development Workshop for CEC faculty.
- April 3, 2009 Orange Public Library, SAC Librarian attended all day "Library Services to Latinos" workshop sponsored by the OC Chapter of REFORMA: The National Association to Promote Library and Information Services to Latinos and Spanish-Speaking http://reformaoc.org/
- May 1, 2009 Santa Ana College Nealley Library, will host the first collaborative Santa Ana Public Library/Santa Ana College Nealley Library gathering to include a tour of SAC library services and resources, meeting and lunch at The Hacienda.
- May 15, 2009 Santa Ana Public Library will host the second collaborative Santa Ana Public Library/Santa Ana College Nealley Library
