## VII. ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION 4235 – Credit By Examination

R. Requena Ramirez expressed concerns with SCC's proposed amendment to AR 4235. She explained in detail how agreements between high school and college instructors are obtained, the process and timelines student undergo to receive credit for high school articulated courses and the differences between high school articulation and dual enrollment. She further stated that approximately sixty (60) SAC programs would be affected, should this policy be adopted as written.

Title 5, section 55301 was reviewed and scrutinized.

B. Sos will contact SCC's Curriculum and Instruction Chair to schedule a meeting in the near future to further discuss AR 4235.

#### VIII. OTHER

B. Sos stated that the same methodology as previous years will be applied to this year's catalog production.
