I. PUBLIC COMMENTS

K. Patterson encouraged faculty to create Honor courses. She stated that departments who offer stacked honor courses have had good success. No separate contract is needed, just the class. Faculty may earn Flex credit based on how many students enroll as well as for doing contracts.

IVa. Accreditation Report

J. Lamb mentioned that he is hoping to begin a movement for faculty to begin thinking of outcome assessment. He stressed the importance of integrating planning, outcome assessment and evaluating what faculty do in the classroom. He stated that the classroom is the core of the institution and follow through on student outcome is of utmost importance. He reminded faculty that accreditation is 3 to 4 years away and the need to recognize opportunity and responsibility on outcomes should live within the curriculum process. He also stressed the significant contribution of outcome assessment.

B. Sos stressed the importance of integrated Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) process including resource requests. Also, accreditation dictates that SLOs be included in the Course of Record (COR) for the next visit.

K. Patterson mentioned that SLO's were tied to General Education (GE) in the past. B. Sos stated that SLOs should be tied the COR and content should drive SLOs which will lead to Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs). Discussion followed.

IVb. Articulation Report

P. Canzona reported that CSU and UC have announced two (2) additional submission deadlines, this year only, for new Math and English courses that support AB705. November 12th is the deadline for UC Transferability and March 1st for inclusion in CSU-GE and IGETC.

Students' right to guided self-placement (GSP) in Math and English classes, whether to keep certain prerequisites in place, large unit courses that include non-transferrable units that may affect student and their Financial Aid were also discussed.

IVc. CurricUNET Update

B. Sos mentioned that he had hoped to present META and its functionality to the faculty. Unfortunately, program issues encountered earlier in the day were preventing him for doing so. He stated that once the system is up-and-running again, he will be sending a list of requests/tasks to all CIC members to test the system. He requested that all glitches, nuances and possible missing information be reported to this body at the next scheduled meeting.

IVd. Guided Pathways

K Patterson expressed her appreciation to all who answered the Degree Grouping Name Survey. She reported that approximately 180 responses were received. She further stated that Pathways is currently working on descriptors in each area and reminded everyone about the Program Mapping deadlines coming up at the end of October.
