# V. Guided Pathways (GP) and Student Equity and Achievement (SEA)

M. Aguilar-Beltran shared a PowerPoint Presentation related to the USC Equity Leadership Alliance. She described it as an alliance that unites community colleges across the state which include high quality professional learning experiences on an assortment of topics pertaining to racial equity. She shared that V. Hubbard had been responsible for the collaboration/partnership. She expressed her gratitude to all who participated.

M. Aguilar-Beltran described the CIC specific sessions, containing content related to classroom, which included meaningfully integrating race across the curriculum, fostering, and sustaining inclusive classrooms for students of color, opposing the erasure of Asian Americans, Pacific Islanders, and Native Americans as well as understanding the confronting Anti-Black Racism. She also mentioned that the sessions were recorded and can be found in the public H drive. She asked that the link not be share with anyone outside of the college.

M. Aguilar-Beltran outlined that the next steps should be to schedule a meeting to review all the recommendations, prioritize them and create an action plan by reviewing and sharing the student campus climate data with the college. The data will be used to for future planning related to Guided Pathways and Equity.

M. Aguilar-Beltran mentioned that the second equity minded workshop is this coming Friday. She also stated that an on-going allocation, for monetary support, as part of the structure is actively being sought.

Discussion followed.

### VI. Distance Education – DE Addendum

C. Kushida stated that the goal is to make the Distance Education Addendum as easy and simple as possible for all DE changes. She described the new DE modalities and types of delivery modalities. As modalities were reviewed for auditing, it was decided to include 2 modalities – Asynchronous and Synchronous – which will encompass all modalities and the Fully Online with Mutual Agreement (FOMA). She explained that all options – Online, Remote Live, Hybrid, Virtual Hybrid and FOMA – are still appearing in the DE tab within META. She explained that she and the Curriculum Office are diligently working with Governet to ensure updates on the tab are made. The goal is to have the DE tab, with the 2 modalities and FOMA, updated within the next couple of weeks.

C. Kushida mentioned that courses that will be taught in Intersession 2022 and beyond that have FOMA only, will need to have a DE form approved by CIC before the modality can be used. She reminded faculty that FOMA ends December 31, 2021. She encouraged faculty to reached out to their constituents to ensure that the information reaches everyone who may be impacted.

Discussion ensued.

### VII. ASCCC's Resources for Proposed Reorganization

C. Coyne explained that ASCCC Resolution Number 01.06 Department Organization was presented SAC Academic Senate at their last meeting. The Academic Senate moved to affirm this resolution with next steps to be discussed at upcoming Senate Meeting. She inquired if there had been feedback from Division faculty on this resolution and if CIC should take a stance on the resolution. She also asked if CIC supports ASCCC's affirmation of the resolution. If in support or not, should the decision made by this committee be presented to the SAC Academic Senate? She opened the floor for discussion.

He further stated that although a formal presentation has not been given to this committee, he is looking for the best possible outcome. He stated that he has been trying to get as much feedback as possible.
- C. Coyne commented that all faculty should have the opportunity to raise concerns; thus, she created an email account, not tied to the district, where faculty may provide input.
