# V. ASCCC's Resolution 09.01 and other updates on Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility (DEIA) in Curriculum

M. Aguilar-Beltran spoke about the Student Equity Planning Institute (SEPI) and encouraged all members to listen to the Equity Plan 2.0 video presentation by L. Bond. She explained the Student Equity Plan 1.0 and the updates in Plan 2.0.

M. Aguilar-Beltran reported on the current Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) Resolutions regarding Resources for Racial Justice and Critical Race Theory and the addition of Culturally Responsive Curriculum, Equity Mindedness and Anti-Racism to the Course Outline of Record (COR), please refer to PowerPoint Presentation. She also mentioned that a Resolution to adopt DEI in the Curriculum Model Principles and Practices Framework is going through the approval process this semester.

# VIII. Reports and Announcements

## a. Accreditation

C. Coyne mentioned that meeting with the visiting Accreditation Committee members had been positive. She also commented that a commendation for sustainability efforts may be coming our way. She expressed her gratitude to all faculty who attended the meeting and participated in the discussion.

F. Ortiz reported that the ACCJC visiting team held several interviews with a variety of constituency groups and participatory governance committees on March 8 and 9. They also held two Open Forums and one Exit Report during their time with us. The visiting team's focus was on two core inquiries; 1) implementation of improvements/redesign for assessment and program review that support resource allocation and 2) the college's implementation and alignment with District-wide sustainability efforts. Santa Ana College will receive the commission's accreditation decision and/or recommendations in June.

# b. Guided Pathways (GP) and Student Equity and Achievement (SEA) See comments under Item V.

## c. META Updates

C. Coyne reported that there are 140 proposals in 'in review' status and 146 proposals in 'daft' mode in META. She requested the assistance of all faculty in removing old proposal from the workflow or to move them forward for approval. She stated that the Distance Education tab, within META, has been updated; thus, it is important to ensure that proposals are kept up to date.

The process to remove a 'draft' proposal from the workflow is by deleting the draft. To remove an 'in review' proposal, contact the Curriculum Office so that the proposal can be unlauched and moved to draft mode so faculty can delete it.

C. Coyne shared that a reviewer from the Chancellor's Office expressed commendations on the great work faculty is doing with program submissions and attaching all necessary accompanying documents.

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# d. Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory (COCI) Correspondence

C. Coyne explained the Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory (COCI) System Advisory Memorandum and the potential impact the scheduled maintenance periods may have in the production of the catalog and class schedule. She encouraged faculty to submit programs and courses for approval towards the beginning of the semester rather than the end of the scheduled meetings. She reminded faculty that all courses and programs, once approved by CIC, need to be approved by the Board of Trustees which may cause delays in submission to the state's COCI system.

Discussion ensued.

# e. Chancellor's Office Common Course Numbering Survey

C. Coyne stated that the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) received a request from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office to forward a survey to faculty groups regarding AB 1111 (Berman, 2021), directing California community colleges to adopt a student-facing common course numbering system down to the college catalog level, beginning with transfer pathway and general education courses. The survey will be sent to all CIC members via email after the conclusion of this meeting. Responses are due Friday, March 18<sup>th</sup>.

Discussion followed.

# f. Brown Act Update

C. Coyne reported that there have been no changes to the Governor's Executive Order extending AB 361 which amended the Brown Act to allow teleconference meetings beyond March 31, 2022; thus, our first in person CIC Meeting is scheduled for April 18, 2022.
