I. PUBLIC COMMENTS

D. Vu introduced J. Tolentino as her CIC successor.

M. Taylor announced that Digital Media Arts and Graphic design courses and programs will be transitioning to Digital Media. C. Pierce also mentioned that Animation courses will also be moved to Digital Media.

C. Emley announced that she will be replacing M. Steckler as the Nursing CIC representative.

C. Truong asked for an update on his request on the wordings "and" and "or" found in prerequisites within the Course Outline of Record (COR).

IV.a. Accreditation Report

F. Ortiz reported that Accreditation is moving along. A successful writing summit was conducted during the summer which produced goals. There are areas that need additional work and evidence. Committee is working on a rough draft that will be completed by the end of Fall 2020.

IV.b. Articulation Report

P. Canzona reminded members that C-ID approved courses that are undergoing reviews need to be virtually identical to the approved descriptors. She further mentioned that any changes to C-ID approved courses should usually be technical in nature only.

P. Canzona also cautioned faculty about the General Education (GE) Proposal tab in META. She explained that if faculty wish to add a new or existing course to a GE pattern (SAC GE, CSU-GE, IGETC) they will indicate proposed GE area(s) and rationale under this tab. If a course has existing GE designation(s) and no change is desired, then faculty will answer "no" to the first question and nothing further is required.

Cross listed courses need to identify the course they are cross listed with in both department CORs. It is important that they match to avoid any articulation issues. Cross-listed courses should always be brought forward at the same time, during the revision process, to ensure cross-listing accuracy.

IV.c. currlQūnet META Update

B. Sos addressed C. Truong's question during public comments by explaining that Governet has four (4) separate rules on how requisites are done in META versus currlQunet Version 2 (V2). B. Sos stated that he will be sharing the rules with the committee. He proposed that a work-group be formed to tackle the various issues related to how requisites appear in META prior to the next catalog.

B. Sos stated that he sent an email to Deans, CIC members and Department Chairs that contained a list of over thirteen-hundred (1300) courses that required a designation of a traditional DE addendum or Fully Online with Mutual Agreement (FOMA). He mentioned that he is still waiting for approximately three quarters (3/4) of departments to submit their spreadsheets. The issue will be discussed once again at the next CIC Meeting. He encouraged faculty to complete DE traditional forms as soon as possible. For courses that will not have traditional DE forms, he will request that Governet auto populate those courses with the information found in the FOMA form.

B. Sos asked CIC members and their constituents to review the current catalog and request that any corrections be reflected in the upcoming 2020-2021 catalog addendum.

IV.d. Guided Pathways (GP)

S. Clark reported that GP successfully launched the CAP success teams. She further mentioned that Starfish will be used to communicate with students. Monthly career explorations for each CAP will be conducted. She also mentioned that the fourth (4th) pillar, Ensure Learning, was launched during Professional Development week.

IV. OTHER

B. Sos stated that cultural competency, involvement and engagement will need to be part of the COR moving forward. Institutional, Department, and Committee dialogue (including the CIC) will need to occur prior to establishing COR expectations. A work group will be formed so keep this on your radar.

B. Sos mentioned that duplication of curriculum and the concerns surrounding the occurrences needs to be discussed and addressed.

B. Sos reported that BP 4235 and AR 4235 have changed to credit for prior learning. Students who can demonstrate knowledge and skills of a course through prior learning experiences can receive college credit for what they know and what they can do. The process for implementation is being developed by a workgroup this semester. Administrative Regulations (AR) and Board Policies (BP) 4235 need to be in place by December 31st. B. Sos asked to let him know if anyone is interested.

B. Sos provided a brief synopsis of Correspondence Education (CE) as it relates to continuing education courses. He suggested that a tab in Meta is not realistic nor necessary, but an attachment is likely to be reviewed at our next meeting. Discussion will continue in future CIC meetings.

M. Grant asked for a formalized process of when and how newly approved programs are submitted to ACCJC. B. Sos will discuss the issue with the Vice President of Academic Affairs (VPAA) and the Technical Committee members.
