# IV. ACTION: CORRESPONDENCE EDUCATION ADDENDUM (First Read)

D. Khalid stated that the Santa Ana Police Department (SAPD) had agreed to allow the Inmate Program to continue with student education by distributing coursework via Correspondence Education (CE). This type of education will provide instructional materials by mail. CE will utilize paper and pencil format packets that are created by Inmate Education instructors and delivered to and picked up from the Santa Ana jail facility on a weekly basis. She explained that this method of teaching will only be conducted during the pandemic we are in the midst of and because the board of prisons has suspended the formal educational face-to-face programs in federal prisons. Once face-to-face education is allowed, CE will be discontinued. D. Khalid asked for approval of the document presented.

- B. Sos requested that CIC members take the information and document back to their respective constituents for further discussion. The item will be placed as second read at the CIC Meeting on October 12<sup>th</sup>.
- M. Grant suggested that CE be reevaluated and explored in other areas that may be beneficial to students.

## V. DISCUSSION: MIS DATA ELEMENTS PROCESS

B. Sos explained Management Information System (MIS) CB codes, specifically, CB04 – Course Credit Status, CB05 – Course Transfer Status, and CB09 – Course SAM Priority Code. He stated that there seems to be some confusion with CB04 and our catalog language. He is awaiting clarification from the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) on CB04 interpretation. For CB05, P. Canzona will be applying the appropriate transfer status code. In regards to CB09, he asked if the element is the responsibility of the faculty, division secretaries or division dean as it has been in the past. Discussion ensued. B. Sos requested that members provide feedback from their constituents so that a process could be formulated and voted on.

B. Sos mentioned that in March 2019, Governet changed CB04 codes in many of our courses during an update to the system. He stated that he will be emailing CIC members a spreadsheet that contains CB04 coding for their review. He requested that information be returned with the correct coding.

# VI. DISCUSSION: CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING

B. Sos presented Palomar College's Board Policy 4235, Credit for Prior Learning, which references Title 5, Section §55050. He shared that the document addressed Credit for Prior Learning in a non-controversial manner. He stated that his recommendation would be to include industry of recognized credentials to the language.

B. Sos informed the committee that RSCCDs BP 4235 needs to be revised, to meet current Title 5 changes, to have a second read, and to be approved by this committee by the end of October. This will ensure that it goes to the Academic Senate for their approval in November and is submitted to the Board of Trustees in December.

Discussion followed with faculty asking about Credit by Exam, Pass/No Pass letter grades and articulated high school courses.

B. Sos asked for follow-up feedback at the next CIC Meeting.

## VII. DISCUSSION: ART/DIGITAL MEDIA CURRICULUM

- S. Clark shared the Digital Medial Model Curricula with the council. She discussed possible innovative alignment of courses reflective of work-force needs, mission and vision goals, courses that are recommended to be same as or crossed linked with the ART, benefits to students, Advisory Board recommendations, student support data and top five (5) colleges in the state with the highest number of students earning a locally issued certificates, Chancellor's Office approved certificates, associate degrees and/or applied baccalaureate degree.
- P. Marquez presented the Digital Media/Art Proposal in which he outlined the courses the ART department is agreeing to turn over to Digital Media (DM), courses they would like to maintain in ART and courses that both departments agree will be same as courses.
- P. Marquez and D. Hostetter expressed concern with the moving of certain courses to DM. Their concern centered on students' transferability to four-year institutions, having a solid fine arts background and the students' ability to think critically and problem-solve within the art discipline.

C. Pierce shared concern that animation curriculum has been housed in the ART Department; however, no sections have been offered. She implored to the council to consider students and offer students courses they may need to further their educational goals.

Discussion ensued. B. Sos reminded members that the Academic Senate is asking for a recommendation from this council as to where the curriculum in question should be housed.

## VIII.a. ACCREDITATION REPORT

M. Grant reported that co-leads will be meeting this week and will review documents submitted. Accreditation process continues to move along. Accreditation training is scheduled for the morning of October 9th.

B. Sos will send a spreadsheet to all CIC member to ensure the accuracy of FOMA form completion by Governet. If FOMA was missed on a course, it will be the responsibility of the discipline to ensure a DE addendum or FOMA form is added.

K. Patterson reported that teams are working on goals. October is People, Ideas and Culture month. A climate change discussion activity will be held this month, so stay tuned for the exciting presentation. She also stated that it was puzzling that a low number of freshman students registered for English and Math courses this semester.
