III. Update/Discussion of Major Student Success & Equity Bodies of Work

- a. Student Success Goals The IEPI and Institutional Set Standards
 - 1. Achieving these goals requires transformational goals through the eyes of the students.
 - 2. When we look at the overall goals, we need to see specifically which students are disproportionally impacted. Is the organization designed to connect students?
 - 1. Breakdown by category/student demographics not % as a whole
 - 3. Two tools going out this week to assist with program review and workshops are being created to share with Faculty (On the Research Website under Research Tools)
 - SEAT (Student Equity Action Tool)
 - i. Data can also be shared with students to show success rates.
 - 1. Possibility: workshops for students so they can be aware of SEAT and how to use it?
 - ii. Mary data is also important for SLO's.
 - iii. Please make any suggestions to Research if you see anything you think would help improve SEAT.
 - Degree and Certificates Awarded Tool Reminder that degrees are not automatically awarded, impacts financial aid
 - Examples of what SAC data is showing us:
 - i. Students appear to have greater course success after using the Learning Center. How many hours are required to impact this?
 - ii. Course success in statistics is lower, but twice as many students are now taking this course. In other words, a greater number of students are experiencing success.
