Key Supports Enabled by SEAP Funding

- Laptops and charging carts were purchased (students were not allowed to use them)
- Cohort recruitment refreshments and snacks
- Office supplies, notebooks, and classroom demonstration supplies.
- Was supposed to cover the National Child Development
 Associate Certification (Invoice submitted before deadline, but funds were never released.)
- CPR certification costs were covered in SU 25 for the cohort that was to start Fall 2025. The program was halted after SU 25



Key Supports Challenges

Challenges:

- Limited systemic support
- •Limited leadership available- shared 15-hour coordinator with a big non-credit program.
- •The program was developed and run largely with the coordinator and/or instructor volunteer hours.
- Due to departmental limitations, students could not access
 SEAP-funded laptops. Instead, they used the shared computer lab weekly, limiting their computer proficiency and access to CDA practice resources.
