See Title 22 regulations chapter 3.1, 3.5, and OCEMS policies 510.00, 530.00 for additional information. Programs are also responsible to notify OCEMS within 30 days of any change in key program staff, address or other program elements. EMT training programs must maintain and update, when necessary, a list of EMT skills verifiers with OCEMS. The OCEMS licensing desk will deny any submitted EMT applications that do not have approved training staff names on an EMT skills verifying documentation or EMT course completion certificate.
