1. AMERICAN INSTITUTIONS REQUIREMENT <i>Not part of Cal-IGETC but may be completed at SAC.</i> <u>CSU</u> has an American Institutions graduation requirement that is separate from Cal-GETC. Courses used to meet the requirement can usually also be used in Area 3 or 4. To meet the CSU requirement, students should take Political Science C1000 or C1000H (101/101H) AND one of the following courses: History 118, 123, 124, 124H, 127, 146, C1001, C1001H (formerly 120/120H), C1002, C1002H (formerly 121/121H) <u>UC</u> requires the completion of a college course or courses with a grade of "C" or better OR a one-year course in high school in U.S. History or a half-year course in U.S. History and a half-year course in American Government with grades of "C" or better (UCLA requires an average grade of "B" or better). UCSB requires the completion of a college course. If you are using college coursework to satisfy this requirement, check the appropriate UC catalog to determine which course(s) to take.				
2. LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH (LOTE) REQUIREMENT – UC ONLY Though not part of Cal-GETC, students transferring to the University of California are encouraged (varies by campus/major) to demonstrate competence in a language other than English equivalent to two years/second level of high school instruction. It is typically demonstrated by completing two (in some cases three) years of high school study in the same language with a grade of C or higher, completing a college course with a C or higher, or by eligible AP/IB exam scores. Consult with a UC admissions representative to confirm if a SAC course listed below, deemed to be equivalent to 2 years of high school study, meets the requirement at the specific UC campus. NOTES: - Students who completed IGETC-approved courses prior to Fall 2025, including courses that are no longer active in assist.org, may apply those courses in the same Cal-GETC area(s) for certification. (Students eligible to seek IGETC certification may use Cal-GETC-approved courses in the same area(s)—whether newly created or newly approved as of Fall 2025.) Courses must be included on the Cal-GETC (or IGETC) certification list at the time completed. - Certification of coursework from other California Community Colleges completed for Cal-GETC will be honored provided that a course was on a college's approved Cal-GETC (or IGETC, see #1) certification course list when it was completed. The coursework will be applied to the subject area <i>in which it is listed by the institution where the work was completed</i>. See www.assist.org. - Although a course may be listed in more than one area, it can only be applied to a single area for Cal-GETC certification. - Courses taken at other U.S. institutions (which do not maintain a Cal-GETC certification list) with accreditation from ICAS approved (formerly regional) accreditors will be placed in the subject areas for which Santa Ana College has equivalent courses. In some cases non-equivalent courses may also be considered. Please see a counselor for additional information. International coursework, from an institution without accreditation from an ICAS approved accreditor, cannot be applied to Cal-GETC. - Courses with fewer than 3 semester or 4 quarter units generally cannot be used toward Cal-GETC certification. - Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate exams can be applied to Cal-GETC. See the SAC catalog for score requirement(s) and GE area(s) awarded. - No more than 14 semester units (21 quarter units) of Pass/No Pass, excluding credit by exam, may be used toward Cal-GETC certification. - Partial Cal-GETC certification is generally not allowed, however some UC campuses may accept it. Please see a counselor for more information.				
CAUTION: Cal-GETC/IGETC completion is not recommended, or in some cases accepted, by all UC campuses and/or majors. Cal-IGETC "Certification" refers to the official designation provided by Santa Ana College that a student has completed all Cal-GETC requirements. Students fully certified in Cal-GETC are also qualified to receive a Certificate of Achievement in Cal-GETC. <i>It is the student's responsibility to request certification by submitting a completed certification/certificate of achievement petition to the Admissions and Records Office prior to established deadlines.</i>
