I. Welcome and Introductions:

A. Stephanie Clark commenced the meeting at 1:00pm and introduced Rob Johnstone and Priya Chaplot from National Center for Inquiry and Improvement

II. Updates, Debriefs, and Next Steps:

A. Progress/Completion-Discussion facilitated by NCII CAGP guests

- i. Rob Johnstone began a conversation on Progress and completion. Gave recommendations on various topics:
- ii. Recommended bulleted list of each team to identify intersections ahead of time. Suggest not more 2-3 target focus. Naming of the items. Naming what you are trying to solve.
- iii. Common challenges that can be tackled and some that can be done in a different climate, after covid
- iv. Be realistic about people's energy. Do things with phases.
- v. GP is not an initiative but a framework. Not a thing you are doing but what you are becoming
- vi. Encouraged progress over perfection

III. Follow-Up Items:

A. Learning and Engagement

i. Stephanie Clark shared details and active plans for Learning and Engagement. Currently working on a curriculum audit. Also working with Career Ladders to assist in how to recruit faculty. Equity is central in the conversations being held, incorporating T3 frameworks and anti-racist curriculum design. Shared Coffee with Colleague sessions are held to have casual space for faculty and staff to enter into dialogue. Amberly Chamberlain spoke on her focus of Professional developments and trainings that have been gearing up with themes and dialogue. Dr. Jarek Janio shared Outcome Assessment work and how to improve outcomes in the classroom.

B. Success Teams

Dr. Maria Dela Cruz shared the details on the creation of Success Teams, Role
a Likes, and CAP Coordinators and the fuse of Equity Professional
Development. She shared data on the goal of incoming students that the

- iii. Priya commented that there is real power with data but can be a danger if your accountability to the data is not happening.
