 - Recommendations to Academic Senate on Flex Policies. We recommend these policies:
 - Presenters earn 2.0 hours of flex credit for each hour of a new or repeated workshop. Multiple presenters all receive 2.0 hours of flex credit.
 - ii. Workshop approval by faculty professional development coordinator, faculty professional development work group, division dean or department chair.
 - iii. Personal flex projects must be approved by the individual's supervisor.
 - iv. Change AS Retreat to Tuesday of flex week and offer mandatory/highly recommended workshops on Wednesday of flex week.
 - v. Fall only: SAC Days (student orientation days on Monday & Tuesday of flex week). Faculty may present and/or attend these sessions and receive flex credit.
 - Additional flex policy items discussed:
 - i. Flex guidelines/examples would help faculty understand what type of activities qualify for flex credit
 - ii. We need to have training on the system
 - iii. We need to have clear messaging about dates/deadlines to be aware of and consequences of not completing flex.
 - iv. Flex alerts would remind faculty of upcoming deadlines for submission of projects requests, reports, etc.
 - v. Possible consequences for failure to complete flex hours: Carrot or stick approach? Participating in flex is a contractual obligation for instructional faculty but we want professional development to be something that they view as beneficial and want to participate in.

- vi. Issue: flex is required for instructional faculty. Noninstructional faculty may submit a staff development plan. Are non-instructional faculty entitled to time for PD?
