# Feature your Leadership abilities

For example, showcasing your ability to collaborate with fellow educators and provide coaching and mentorship to your colleagues will send a strong message to hiring managers that you're the right fit for their work culture. Below, you'll find examples to help you feature your leadership abilities on your resume.

#### Example 1:

Good: Managed classrooms with up to 20 preschool students, maintained a safe and nurturing learning
environment, communicated with students to resolve behavioral conflicts with peers, and coordinated with
parents to support academic, emotional, and social growth

• Bad: Instructed classes with preschool students, spoke with parents regarding behavior, and helped students improve discipline and behavior in the classroom

### Example 2:

- Good: Led a team of 10+ early childhood teachers at a premier inner-city preschool, conducted performance
  evaluations, evaluated teaching strategies, provided ongoing mentorship, and collaborated with team members
  to develop an engaging curriculum
- Bad: Oversaw a team of childhood teachers, reviewed performance, provided feedback, and helped to maintain working relationships

- Bad: A preschool teacher seeking opportunity to grow as an educator with your school. A hard worker and team player who excels in communication and problem solving.

### Example 2:

- Good: A Senior Education Professional with over eight years of teaching experience, specializing in early childhood education, experiential instruction, and program management. A proven track record of coordinating with multidisciplinary teams to refine curriculum design.
- Bad: A certified early childhood teacher looking for a high-paying job within the education field. Excited for the chance to advance teaching career with your preschool.
