- I. Welcome, Introductions & Committee Purpose: Sara Lundquist and George Sweeney, Co-Chairs.

 - a. Approve the minutes from February 17, 2017.
- II. Action Items from Previous Meetings
 - a. CAI (Common Assessment Initiative) and Multiple Measures Update and Conversation –Maria Aguilar Beltran.
 - 1. CAI Task force has met and the math, English, ESL/EMLS, & reading faculty will be completing competency mapping by August 1, 2017.
 - 2. Multiple Measures –students are now being placed by multiple measures, i.e. high school GPA, etc. Students will receive a placement recommendation letter with the highest possible placement for math, ESL/EMLS, English & reading. Multiple Measures diminishes the potential impact of CAI. Course seats for F17 will be based on F16 assessment center data 1,000's of students will quality for different courses for Fall 17 based on the new process being implemented (placement test, review CCC apply for self-reported GPA, etc.) Waivers will have already need to be inputted.
 - 1. We need to come up with a good consultation model in regards to how many sections are going to be built based on

placement changes

- b. Academic Computing Center Update
 - 1. ACC stopped collecting attendance this academic year
 - 2. Student Services team and Academic Affairs team developed plans and will submit to Academic Senate and to Department Chairs for input.. Going to create areas where students can convene, study, receive one stop advisement services. Furniture will be ordered in 2-3 weeks. Goal is a Fall 17 semester launch. 3rd IQ bar will also go in this area.
- c. Professional Development Update
 - 1. Professional Development is being created for classified staff as well as for faculty. Areas for PD include threat assessment, emergency response, technology, pedagogy)
 - 2. Hiring a Senior Clerk to help support
 - 3. Suggestion: Order buttons for AB 540 Allies to wear.
- d. Increasing student awareness of services that they need and student input
 - 1. Work with ASG/Research to co-host forums in order to talk to students about what will help make them more successful.
 - 2. Suggestion: meet with ASG representatives
 - 3. How do we also make faculty and staff aware of Student Equity?
 - 4. Suggestion: presentation on what SS&E is and what we do. Create a "cheat sheet" with information about Student Success & Equity (Did you know...?) Research can provide an action corner that shows what strategies people are using in order to improve results. Highlight people who have taken effective actions. Research can work with PD in order to survey faculty to see if they are using data and see what worked for their programs. Encourage faculty mentoring. Create a collaborative Student Success lab to bring faculty together to think together about Student Success.
