- I. Welcome and Introductions- Dr. Ortiz and Maria Aguilar began the meeting at 3:00 pm
 - a. Welcome ASG Student Rep- Scotty Escobar- ASG Senator of Humanities
 - i. Dr. Ortiz and Maria Aguilar welcomed SEAP's new student representative for Fall 2021, Scotty Escobar

II. Action Items:

- a. Approval of Minutes from June 3, 2021 Dr. Ortiz made a motion to approve June 3, 2021 minutes. Dr. Maria Dela Cruz moved to approve, Scotty Escobar seconded. Minutes approved as presented.
- III. Public Comments: Comment was made regarding upcoming SEAP committees and whether they would be via Zoom. Dr. Ortiz mentioned that further direction is still pending and would be providing an update based on Brown Act teleconference administrative regulations still being negotiated. Mentioned that as of this meeting (9/16/2021) the plan is for voting members to meet in person for the October meeting. Voting members can send a proxy if they are unable to attend. Notification to the chairs would be required to note and count their vote as official proxy. Committee will be notified in advance of any meeting location changes.

IV. Presentations & Feedback

- a. Membership 2021-2022
 - i. Dr. Ortiz shared the SEAP membership list. CSEA vacancies are still pending. CSEA's Sheryl Martin has reached out to classified and will be sending and update on potential members.

- b. Roles, Responsibilities, and Expectations and Engagement- Dr. Ortiz went over the Participatory Governance committee member roles, responsibility and engagement expectations from the Governance Handbook. Shared portions that mention Robert Rules/Brown Act guidelines and recommended that committee members review the handbook to familiarize themselves with the most up to date information as committee members.
 - Brave Space Community Guidelines Maria Aguilar Beltran shared the following Brave Space Community Guidelines for this semesters SEAP committee:
 - 1. Create space at the beginning of our meetings to do a land acknowledgement
 - 2. Be true to yourself. We want to create an atmosphere for open, honest exchange.
 - 3. Commit to learning from each other. Listen to each other and acknowledge that we all come from different backgrounds, skills, interests, abilities, and values. We realize that it is these very differences that will increase our awareness and understanding through this process.
 - 4. Acknowledge each other's experiences. We will not devalue people for their experiences, lack of experiences, or difference in interpretation of those experiences.
 - 5. Trust that others are doing the best they can. We will try not to 'freeze people in time' but leave space for everyone to learn and change through our interactions with one another.
 - 6. Challenge the idea and not the person. If we wish to challenge something that has been said, we will challenge the idea or the practice referred to, not the individual sharing this idea or practice.
 - 7. Speak your discomfort. If something is bothering you and you are open to sharing, please share it with the group. Often our emotional reactions to this process offer the most valuable learning opportunities.
 - 8. Step Up, Step Back. Be mindful of taking up much more space than others. On the same note, empower yourself to speak up when others are dominating the conversation.
 - 9. Work to recognize your privileges. Use this space to recognize and investigate your privileges (for example: class, gender, sexual orientation, ability). Honor the different experiences we all bring to this space.

a. Items c and d were merged as the conversation on goals began to take place. - c. Guided Pathways Stephanie Clark- Shared that Guided Pathways is launching its inaugural Equity-minded Teaching and Learning Institute this year. Membership in the cohort has been confirmed.
