SANTA ANA COLLEGE FOUNDATION RECEIVES \$25,000 GIFT FROM SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON

Donation will support STEM Scholarships and the Santa Ana College Promise Program

Santa Ana, Calif. – The Santa Ana College (SAC) Foundation recently received a \$25,000 donation from Southern California Edison (SCE) to benefit two key SAC initiatives: the Santa Ana College Promise Program and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) scholarships. This marks the seventh year in a row that the Foundation has received such a gift.

"We are delighted and deeply grateful for Southern California Edison's continued commitment to SAC students," said Ken Purcell, SAC foundation board president. "SCE's financial support allows students to focus on their education and achieve their academic goals."

The Santa Ana College Promise Program (formerly *¡Adelante!*) provides every Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) high school graduate—who enrolls at SAC full-time—with many benefits to ensure their success. This includes priority registration, free tuition their first year, and guaranteed admission to either California State University, Fullerton (CSUF) or the University of California, Irvine (UCI) – as long as grade point average requirements are met for each institution.

SCE's donation directly compliments the Santa Ana College Promise Program, by funding services for Promise students such as counseling and academic mentoring, among others.

STEM scholarship programs include dozens of opportunities for students who are planning careers within the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. STEM scholarship recipients often have the ability to reduce or even eliminate the time they spend working in order to gain more time for studies in their chosen field; thus, increasing their chances to complete their post-secondary education and earn a degree.

"SCE and SAC's direct, public-private partnership makes a marked difference in the success rate of our students; not only in college, but also as they move beyond the classroom and into the workforce," said Christina Romero, executive director of the SAC Office of College Advancement and Foundation. "The benefits are far-reaching, as ultimately these types of donations have a positive impact on economic development across Orange County and beyond."
